Eye on AI Guidelines

Thank you for contributing to *Applied Radiology's* Eye on AI. The purpose of this section is to discuss the latest and emerging uses of AI within the practice of radiology, from clinical to workflow applications.

These invited review articles, which sometimes follow the format of a column or editorial, are written by physicians with expertise in this technology, some of whom are stakeholders in AI companies or products. While this is noted in the article disclosures, we require authors to follow the editorial policies applicable to any of the content that we accept for publication. This includes:

- Presenting a balanced discussion on the topic that includes all relevant technologies and applications, pros and cons, and encourages further exploration of the subject.
- Using specific examples and backing up information presented as fact, such as data and statistics, with references, quotes, or cited within the text. References should be formatted in AMA style and included in a list at the close of the article.

Content style and format

- Write in a third-person voice.
- Review content for appropriate style, punctuation and grammar. We do not prohibit the use of AI for assistance with writing and editing, but recommend that you review our policies in our [submission guidelines](#).
- When applicable, break content into relevant sections using headings.

Length: 1,000-1,200 words including references if applicable.

References: References are not essential for all content, but they should be used when used when citing studies, statistics, data, and other factual information. References should be cited numerically within the text and be listed at the end of the article in AMA style.
