This work encompasses the relationship of two femme, gueer, Black, and Brown women who face each other seeking to heal the inherited ancestral and familial wounds. They find support in their sisterhood and the power of collective care.

This work is presented by dance Immersion, a charitable non-profit organization established in 1994 to produce, promote, and support dancers and dances of the African Diaspora.



Pianist Luke Welch presents an exciting collection of works by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, highlighting rarely performed solo piano pieces by the famed Black British composer. Hailed by his contemporaries as the "African Mahler" for his musical excellence as a violinist, composer, and conductor, Coleridge-Taylor's music has been making a comeback in recent years including Welch's performances which are among the very first to ever feature his solo piano works.







Drew Jurecka - violin

Drew Jurecka is a Grammy-nominated violinist, arranger, producer, and multi-instrumentalist. Performing regularly with his jazz trio and Venuti String Quartet and as the bandoneonist with Payadora Tango Ensemble. He's toured with artists including Jill Barber, Jeff Healey, John McDermott, Stuart McLean and the Vinyl Cafe. As a studio musician and arranger, Jurecka's arrangements and playing can be heard on film, TV, and video game soundtracks as well as hundreds of records for artists including Dua Lipa, Alvvays, Dermott Kennedy, Mastodon, Ron Sexsmith, Donovan Woods, Buffy Sainte-Marie, Laila Biali, Barbra Lica, Jill Barber. Jurecka's arrangements have been performed by groups including the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, National Arts Orchestra, Symphony Nova Scotia, Art of Time Ensemble, and the Gryphon Trio. Production credits include Jill Barber, Barbra Lica, Banners, VC2, Payadora Tango Ensemble (for which he won Producer of the Year at the 2024 Canadian Folk Music Awards). He has released one record with his jazz trio, a string quartet record with his original string quartet, and several records with his other projects.



Ewen Farncombe - piano

Ewen Farncombe is a Juno-winning pianist and composer based in Toronto for nearly a decade. Having recorded with numerous bands, he has earned his reputation as a highly skilled musician. While attending Humber College for a degree in music performance, he received several prestigious awards, including the Hnatyshyn Foundation Oscar Peterson award. While jazz is Farncombe's passion, he is known for his versatility in playing many genres of music.



Clark Johnston - bass

Clark Johnston, born in Toronto, started playing cello at age nine and, by age 12, was performing at Roy Thompson Hall with the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra. He moved to Hamilton in high school, switched to bass, and then joined the Hamilton All-Star Jazz Band with the likes of Chris Gale and Chris Lamont. After jazz studies at Mohawk College and McGill University, he started his professional career in Toronto as a bassist in 1994. Johnston has since worked with the likes of Peter Appleyard, Diana Panton, James Brown, Reg Schwager, Don Thompson, as well as The Mike Malone Jazz Orchestra—to name just a few. He holds a master's degree in music composition from York University and is on faculty at McMaster University.
