Tim Beattie - guitar

An artist described as "charismatic" (*The Bath Festival*) and "most subtle and able" (*Perthshire Review*), Canadian guitarist **Tim Beattie** "dazzles...moving between textures and moods with ease." (*Musicworks Magazine*). Following studies at The Royal Conservatory of Music's (RCM) Taylor Academy in Toronto, Cleveland Institute of Music, Conservatorium van Amsterdam, and the Royal Conservatorie of Scotland, Beattie was the first guitarist ever invited to join the prestigious Rebanks Family Fellowship at the RCM. Beattie's studies and artistic projects have been supported by the Amsterdam University of the Arts' AHK Talent Grant, Canada Council for

the Arts, Cleveland Institute of Music Trust, Royal Conservatoire of Scotland Trust, Rebanks Family Fellowship, Royal Overseas League, Sylva Gelber Foundation, Tillett Trust, and The Worshipful Company of Musicians.

Since winning the 2018 Brussels International Guitar Competition, Beattie's performance career has taken him to stages across North America and Europe, with appearances at The Bath Festival, Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity, Brussels International Guitar Festival, Cleveland International Guitar Festival, Kitaranova Festival (Finland), Lammermuir Festival, Perth Concert Hall, opening for artists such as Ludovico Einaudi at Het Concertgebouw Amsterdam and k.d. Lang at FirstOntario Concert Hall, and performing with Nai Berghouti at Blue Note Amsterdam. Beattie has appeared on radio and television broadcasts, including Dutch national TV and BBC Radio Scotland. He has won prizes at the international guitar competitions in Antwerp, Brussels, Calgary, Hamilton, Leicester, and Uppsala.

Beattie is an Associate Teacher of Guitar and Chamber Music at the University of St Andrews Music Centre (UK). He has recently given workshops and masterclasses at the Alberta Strings Association, Calgary Classical Guitar Society, Mount Royal University, Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, University of Alberta, University of Lethbridge, and the University of Regina Conservatory.
