Schleese is also a part of DEUCEnDIP, an all-female hip hop crew that recently celebrated their 10th anniversary. Other credits include the Pan Am Games, Mirror Awards, Rusk Hair Show, Bud light Sensation Concert, IOGO, and CP24 Breakfast Television. Schleese has also worked and performed with such companies as Pratibha Arts, ABS Crew, and Evolution Dance Theatre.

Most recently, she received her Business Administration Diploma at Fanshawe College, is now a new mother, and excited to see how her dance career will evolve!

Melissa Hart - Choreographer

Melissa Hart is an established dance artist from Toronto with a Bachelor of Fine Arts specializing in Dance from York University. With over a decade of experience as a competitive figure skater coupled with her education in classical ballet and contemporary dance, and passion for street and Latin dance styles, she has a widened vocabulary and brings a unique perspective to the stage.

Hart is a member of hip hop dance crew DEUCEnDIP, who recently celebrated their 10th anniversary. With this crew, Hart has been fortunate to create and perform for international concerts such as WE DAY, Canada's Walk of Fame, and World Pride.

Hart is well-versed in salsa, bachata, Argentine tango, and samba dance styles. She has performed for the Toronto Salsa Congress and the Pan Am Games, and opened for International Latin artists such as Bad Bunny, Prince Royce, and Gente de Zona.



In 2011, Lyn was chosen to be a part of *So You Think You Can Dance Canada*'s Top 20. Since then Lyn has been featured in numerous commercials, TV shows, music videos, and movies, and has performed with artists such as Nick Jonas, Lady Gaga, Anne-Marie, Flo Rida, Carly Rae Jepsen, Hedley, and more.



Lilly Giroux - Dancer

Born and raised in Toronto, Lilly Giroux began developing her dance fundamentals at an early age. Throughout school, she trained in the Claude Watson Art Program, and after graduating high school, she furthered her education in Erica Sobol's Gypsy Project and the Sidra Bell Dance Module. She has had the privilege of training under Medhi Walerski, Jermaine Spivey, Adi Salant, and Tilman O'Donnell, and has worked for many talented artists such as Christina Digiuseppe, Alvin Collantes, Rebecca Zizek, and Charles Moulton. Irma Villafuerte is a Salvadorian-Canadian dance artist in Tkaronto. A graduate of George Brown College's dance program, her training extends to Latin American, Caribbean, and Cuban Contemporary technique. She's performed in Rhubarb Festival, DanceWeekend Ontario, Aluna Theatre's RUTAS and Caminos Festival, Panamania 2015 at Nathan Phillips Square, La 12 Bienal de la Habana 2015 for (IN)DISCIPLINAS, Vanguardia Dance Projects Festival, International Dance Meeting by Danza Libre in Guantanamo, Cuba, CounterPulse Performing Diaspora in San Francisco, Mayworks Festival for Working People, among others. She is honoured to be part of works by Jaberi Dance Theatre, Kahawi Dance Theatre, Alejandro

Ronceria, Victoria Mata, Kaeja D'dance, Ryan Lee, Derek Sangster, Arsenio Andrade, Sharon B. Moore, Darryl Tracy, Malgorzata Nowacka. Since 2016, she has been developing her choreographic practice through residencies with Dancemakers, Emerging Voices with Toronto Dance Theatre, and George Brown Dance Ensemble. She currently sits on the board of Adelheid Dance Projects, is a tdsbCREATES resident artist, and on the faculty at Casa Maiz's Semillas Maiz summer camp for Latin American children and Randolph College for the Performing Arts.



Jaz Fairy J - Dramaturge

Jaz Fairy J is a Barbadian-Canadian multi-hyphenate artist who specializes in improvisation with movement and sound. She is a performance artist, choreographer, dancer, singer/songwriter, movement director, outside eye/creative mentor, group facilitator, and skincare creator/small business owner. She believes that art and creation are a portal to the divine in all of us and continuously investigates how her work can create more space for healing.

Based in Toronto, Fairy J has created over 28 original dance works, presented in Toronto, Montreal, North Bay, Brooklyn, Pittsburgh, Seattle, Berlin, Birmingham (U.K.) and Sinop, Turkey. Choreographic commissions include Cahoots Theatre, Toronto Dance Theatre, Soulpepper Theatre, Cawthra Park Secondary School, and Obsidian Theatre to name a few. Fairy J worked on Fox Production's *Rocky Horror Picture Show* under the direction of Kenny Ortega in 2016 and, in 2017, she was featured on CBC's *HERstory in Black* honouring 150 Black Canadian women making a significant contribution in Canada. Her solo *what do you see?* was presented by Summerworks in 2017, receiving an honourable mention for the Jon Kaplan Spotlight Award.

One of her most recent film collaborations *In my Bones*, produced and supported by Black Women Film, premiered last year. Her new multidisciplinary work *The Daily* was curated by Dance Immersion and copresented with the National Arts Center in 2021.

Fairy J was one of the Facilitators for the 20-month Wildseed Center Black Art Fellowship and she has also been working as an outside eye/dramaturg since 2017, for fellow interdisciplinary artists working in dance, theatre, music, performance art, voice and sound creation.
