Ukrainian violinist Dmytro Udovychenko is the Grand Prize laureate of the 2023 Concours musical international de Montréal, where he stunned audiences with his spectacular performance of Shostakovich's Violin Concerto No. 1 with the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal, conducted by Rafael Payare. Born in Kharkiv and currently based in Germany, Udovychenko has also been a top prizewinner at major competitions in Finland, Italy, and Singapore. For his recital debut in Toronto, he will perform works for violin and piano by Szymanowski, Ravel, and others.







Gene Hotta - viola

Gene Hotta is a violist based in Los Angeles, California. He earned his master's degree in music performance at the Schulich School of Music at McGill University studying under Professor Andre Roy. He completed his undergraduate studies in 2021 at the School of Music, Theatre, and Dance (SMTD) at the University of Michigan with Prof. Caroline Coade. Hotta was principal viola for the University Symphony Orchestra at SMTD and the McGill Symphony Orchestra. He also recently won First Prize of the Golden Violin Competition at McGill.

Hotta has attended various prestigious musical festivals such as Music Academy of the West, the Ashkenasi-Kirshbaum Seminar at the Heifetz International Music Institute, and the New York String Orchestra Seminar. In addition, he was recently selected as one of the 10 musicians at the Music Academy of the West in Santa Barbara for the Keston MAX exchange program with the London Symphony Orchestra.

Wei-Tang Huang - piano

Born in Taiwan, Wei-Tang Huang enrolled in the Cleveland Institute of Music at age 13, where he studied with Olga Radosavljevich. He pursued his musical studies at Yale University with Sara Laimon, while he completed a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science. He later obtained his Bachelor of Civil Law and Bachelor of Law at the Faculty of Law at McGill University.

In high demand as a collaborative pianist of string repertoire at the Schulich School of Music at McGill University, he collaborates regularly with faculty members and musicians from the Montreal Symphony Orchestra.
