Songs and Suppression: A Musical Journey out of Exile

In an exploratory program of art songs by Jewish-German composers, Jewish-German pianist Constanze Beckmann and Singaporean Chinese-Canadian baritone Samuel Chan explore topics of xenophobia, racism, exile, and personal/artistic suppression through the contrasting musical styles of the late Romanticism of Walter Braunfels with the serialism, atonalism, and jazz influences of Hanns Eisler's *Hollywood Songbook*.

INSTRUMENTAL SERIES Wed. Nov. 8, 2023, 12–1 p.m. Rogue Duo Common Thread

Featuring works by composers of Iranian and Ukrainian heritage, this performance depicts the ways in which the human spirit rises above adversity and marches onward. The concert includes new works by Rojin Monibi, Niloufar Shahbazi, Mehrdad Jafari Raad, and Eugene Astapov, which were commissioned by ICOT (Saman Shahi, Keyan Emami, Maziar Heidari) – a collective of composers who have also produced a new work for the program. While extremely diverse in their aesthetics, each of these pieces explore the commonality in what it means to be human.







Artun Miskciyan - piano

Artun Miskciyan is a Canadian pianist based in Toronto, Canada. Alongside performing works from the classical repertoire in concerts and recordings, having a multicultural background and being classically trained inspires him to introduce his audience to a unique program that consists of not only classical pieces, but also personal arrangements of select music from different genres and original compositions.

Born to parents of Armenian origin in Istanbul, his programming removes man-made boundaries, creating cultural and musical bridges that bring listeners together and allow them to explore new music along with the music they are familiar with.

He made his Koerner Hall debut last year, performing Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 22 with Sinfonia Toronto. He has given concerts across the U.S., Canada, Italy, Spain, Mexico, and Turkey. He has also released numerous recordings on Spotify, Apple Music, and other streaming platforms, ranging from the classical repertoire to original compositions and world music arrangements.
