ESCAPE TO THE OPERA HOUSE THIS WINTER WITH THE CUNNING LITTLE VIXEN

Toronto – The natural and human worlds converge when Leoš Janáček's *The Cunning Little Vixen* hits the Canadian Opera Company stage this winter for the first time in 25 years. The larger-than-life production from English National Opera infuses the rarely performed gem with thought-provoking sets and fantastical costumes, creating an unforgettable journey into the woods to meet a clever fox who refuses to be fenced in. *The Cunning Little Vixen* runs for seven performances on January 26, 28, February 3, 8, 10, 14, and 16, 2024, at the Four Seasons Centre for the Performing Arts, with an additional Relaxed Performance on February 13, 2024.

A POIGNANT REFLECTION ON OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH PLANET EARTH

When a forest gamekeeper traps a fox and attempts to domesticate her, their encounter inspires a philosophical reflection on the natural cycle of life and death. Despite being composed in the 1920s, *The Cunning Little Vixen* remains surprisingly relevant today, inviting audiences to consider the advancing toll of climate change and importance and urgency of cultivating harmony with our environment.

In the hands of London-based director **Jamie Manton**, alongside associate director **Ruth Knight**, the title vixen's home is not a lush green woodland but, instead, a landscape ravaged by logging and deforestation. Against this backdrop, set and costume designer **Tom Scutt** has created an explosion of colourful silhouettes, including iridescent insects and frilly hens that play up nature's unique and inherent beauty. Pointed lighting from designer **Lucy Carter** underscores the contrasting realms while choreography from **Jenny Ogilvie** skillfully captures the intricacy of movement in creatures great and small.

Musically, *The Cunning Little Vixen* perfectly illustrates why Leoš Janáček is considered one of the most important opera composers of the 20th century. Drawing on a diverse range of influences ranging from Romantic, to folk and Impressionism, the lyrical score provides an innovative and complex sonic universe for the COC Orchestra, led by COC Music Director Johannes Debus, to explore. Price Family Chorus Master Sandra Horst leads the COC Chorus, with members of the Canadian Children's Opera Company (CCOC) taking on many roles, including a pack of fox cubs.

A COLOURFUL CAST OF CHARACTERS

Celebrated Canadian soprano **Jane Archibald** returns to the COC, bringing her world renowned artistry and "enormous singing and stage power" (*Scherzo*) to the leading role of Sharp Ears, the young Vixen. **Archibald** is joined by two artists making COC house debuts: Macedonian-Canadian mezzo-soprano **Ema Nikolovska** in the role of Gold-Stripe, the Fox, and "compelling" (*The Guardian*) English bass-baritone **Christopher Purves** as the Forester.

A number of COC favourites feature prominently in the cast, with mezzo-soprano **Megan Latham**, last seen in the COC's *The Marriage of Figaro* (2022), singing the Forester's Wife/Owl; bass-baritone **Giles Tomkins** as the Priest/Badger; tenor **Adam Luther** as the Innkeeper/Rooster; and mezzo-soprano **Carolyn Sproule** as the Dog, Lapák. The cast also includes four additional rising artists from the COC's **Ensemble Studio**: soprano **Charlotte Siegel**, who starred as Musetta this fall in the COC's *La Bohème*, is the Innkeeper's Wife/Hen; tenor **Wesley Harrison** as the Schoolmaster/Mosquito; bass-baritone **Alex Halliday** as the Poacher; and soprano **Ariane**

Cossette sings the role of Pepik/Woodpecker. Soprano and COC Chorus member **Ilana Zarankin** rounds out the cast as Frantic/Jay.

A MORE INCLUSIVE OPERA-GOING EXPERIENCE

For the company's Relaxed Performance on **February 13, 2024**, the opera itself will remain unchanged but a number of adjustments will be made within the theatre to create a more accessible environment. Sound levels will be lowered, house lights will be dimmed rather than switched off, and audience members will be free to move in and out of their seats as needed. The relaxed performance offers a more casual opera experience which can be ideal for members of the Disability Community, Neurodiverse or Autistic individuals, or anyone who may experience anxiety and/or feel they want extra support to attend an opera.

In this performance, **Ensemble Studio** soprano **Karoline Podolak** steps into the role of the Vixen (Sharp Ears); **Podolak** previously took home First Prize in the COC's Centre Stage: Ensemble Studio Competition in 2022. Canadian mezzo-soprano **Carolyn Sproule** brings her "irresistible charisma" (*Opera News*) to the role of the Fox (Gold-Stripe), and several current and graduate artists of the **COC Ensemble Studio** form the supporting cast: bass-baritone **Joel Allison** as the Forester, mezzo-soprano **Queen Hezumuryango** as the Forester's Wife/Owl, baritone **Korin Thomas-Smith** sings the role of the Poacher, and mezzo-soprano **Alex Hetherington** sings the role of the Dog, Lapák. Conductor **Derek Bate** will lead the **COC Orchestra**.

The Cunning Little Vixen is sung in Czech and presented by the COC with English SURTITLESTM.

The Cunning Little Vixen runs for seven performances at the Four Seasons Centre for the Performing Arts on January 26, 28, February 3, 8, 10, 14, 16, 2024 with a Relaxed Performance held on February 13, 2024.
