## Fidelio, by Ludwig Van Beethoven

Beethoven's only opera follows the story of Leonore, a woman who disguises herself as a man to go undercover into the very prison where she suspects her husband is being held as a political prisoner. As she descends deeper into the prison's cells, she uncovers a sinister plot of abuse and oppression.

Acclaimed director Matthew Ozawa transports the action to a modern-day prison facility, reminding viewers that Beethoven's warnings in Fidelio—about power, corruption, and tyranny—remain as relevant today as they were 200 years ago, while crystallizing the composer's vision for justice and freedom.

When a forest gamekeeper traps a fox and attempts to domesticate her, their encounter leads to a poignant reflection on the natural cycle of life and death, as well as our relationship with the planet. This family-friendly opera invites audiences to reflect on the advancing toll of climate change and the importance of cultivating a harmonious interrelationship with the natural world.

Canadian soprano and COC favourite Jane Archibald stars as the clever fox, Sharp Ears, while COC Music Director Johannes Debus leads the COC Orchestra through Czech composer Leoš Janáček's lush score.

## Don Giovanni, by Wolfgang A. Mozart

February 2, 4, 7, 9, 15, 17, 24, 2024

A co-production of Royal Opera House, Covent Garden; Gran Teatre del Liceu; The Israeli Opera; and Houston Grand Opera

Mozart's dark, twisted masterpiece is presented as you've never seen it before in this breathtaking production from Danish director Kaspar Holten. The show features spectacular set designs combined with ingenious video projections, plunging audiences into an Escher-like web of rotating rooms, revolving with the rhythms of Don Giovanni's infernal drama.

Inside this darkly glamorous world, we witness the playboy's downfall when his latest seduction spirals out of control and leads to murder. In synchronicity with the stylish visuals, COC Music Director Johannes Debus and the COC Orchestra build out the otherworldly architecture of Mozart's score—turn by musical turn—to reveal the most thrilling, adventurous, and elegant music the composer ever wrote.

## **Don Pasquale**, by Gaetano Donizetti April 26, May 2, 4, 8, 10, 12, 14\*, 18, 2024 Sung in Italian with English SURTITLES<sup>TM</sup> A production from Scottish Opera

The aging Pasquale refuses to let his love-struck nephew Ernesto marry, and decides to get married himself. The only snag is that the woman he's chosen as his bride-to-be, the fiery Norina, is secretly his nephew's beloved, which sets up a riotous clash between generations.

This new production marks the first appearance of *Don Pasquale* at the COC in 30 years. Making their company debut, the French-Canadian creative team of Renaud Doucet and André Barbe place this fizzy, feel-good comedy in 1960s Rome, topping it with Technicolor visuals and Pop Art aplomb.

## Medea, by Luigi Cherubini

May 3, 5, 9, 11, 15, 17, 25, 2024

A co-production of the Metropolitan Opera, Greek National Opera, Canadian Opera Company, and Lyric Opera of Chicago

Never before seen on the COC stage and seldom performed anywhere in the world, *Medea* is an exquisite rarity, featuring one of the most challenging roles in opera history. As the culmination of our season, world-renowned soprano Sondra Radvanovsky will tackle the role, reuniting with director Sir David McVicar for this brand-new production.

Medea is based on an ancient Greek myth, in which the title character helps Jason (Giasone), leader of the famous Argonauts, steal the Golden Fleece—only to be abandoned by him. While her betrayal makes Medea a victim, this operatic interpretation gives her the last word as she unleashes her rage with chilling violence against those who have wronged her.

## Aportia Chryptych: A Black Opera for Portia White, by HAUI x Sean Mayes June 14, 15, 16, 2024

A world premiere opera

Nova Scotian contralto Portia White was the first Black Canadian concert performer to achieve international fame in the mid-20th century, hailed as the best classical voice of her generation. Yet, despite her accomplishments, her story has been largely erased from Canadians' collective memory.

Aportia Chryptych: A Black Opera for Portia White is a bold, new Black opera from Canadian director and librettist HAUI and Toronto and New York-based composer Sean Mayes that sets out to reclaim Portia White's story, featuring Canadian soprano Neema Bickersteth and Emmy Award-winning mezzosoprano Adrienne Danrich. The opera begins at the end of Portia's life, as she is thrust into the crossroads of the spirit realm.

As she is fractured into her divine feminine trinity of Body, Soul, and Spirit, she must reconcile the coded and cryptic secrets from her past to shed her earthly existence and finally ascend. Spoken word, rap, folk songs, hip-hop, R&B, and classic opera repertoire collide in an explosive score that seeks to break down musical silos and unite artistic and cultural communities.
