

If you are a student at Canadore College, who was impacted by conflict in your country, you could receive a scholarship valued up to \$10,000!

Canadore College is pleased to advise our community that due to the Russian military invasion of Ukraine, on April 6, 2022, the province announce the creation of a \$1.9 million Ontario-Ukraine Solidarity Scholarship to support student attending Ontario's public assisted colleges and universities. The scholarship will be awarded based on merit and financial need.

Each institution will receive (4) scholarships worth \$10,000 each to award among the applicants. Priority will be given to students from Ukraine first. If you are selected and you are an OSAP student, then know that this scholarship will be reported to the Ministry and your OSAP funding entitlement will be reassessed accordingly, which could potentially decrease your OSAP funding.

Eligibility Criteria:

- You must be a student that was impacted by the conflicts Ukraine or by other conflicts around the globe.
- You must be a registered student at Canadore College for the 2024-2025 academic year.
- You must be physically present in Ontario to qualify.
- You must show financial need. (See budget to complete)
- You must be progressing academically in your program. (Must have a GPA over 2.0 or better)
