



Early Childhood Education

Dual Credits: two high school credits and two college courses

Child Development I – TOF4T (College Course: ECE111)

This course will introduce students to the physical, cognitive, language, social and emotional development of children from conception to early childhood. The course will follow the chronological developmental milestones in childhood, focusing primarily on the sequence of typical development in children (birth to 6 years of age) and how biological, cultural, and environmental factors can influence development. Students will explore educational tools to help facilitate healthy growth and development in children.

Health, Safety and Nutrition – PPU4T (College Course: ECE118)

This course will explore relevant factors that impact the health, safety, nutritional needs and overall wellbeing of young children. Students will explore the role of the educator in upholding provincial legislation, Standards of Practice and common policies, procedures and practices that pertain to supporting holistic and healthy child development within the early learning environment.

Note:

- Tuition, materials and transportation fees will be covered through the Dual Credit program.
- All students are expected to attend an orientation session prior to taking part in any Dual Credit program.
- Students will be contacted by the SCWI Program Assistant, at least one week prior to the start of the program, to be provided with a date, time and location for each orientation session.
