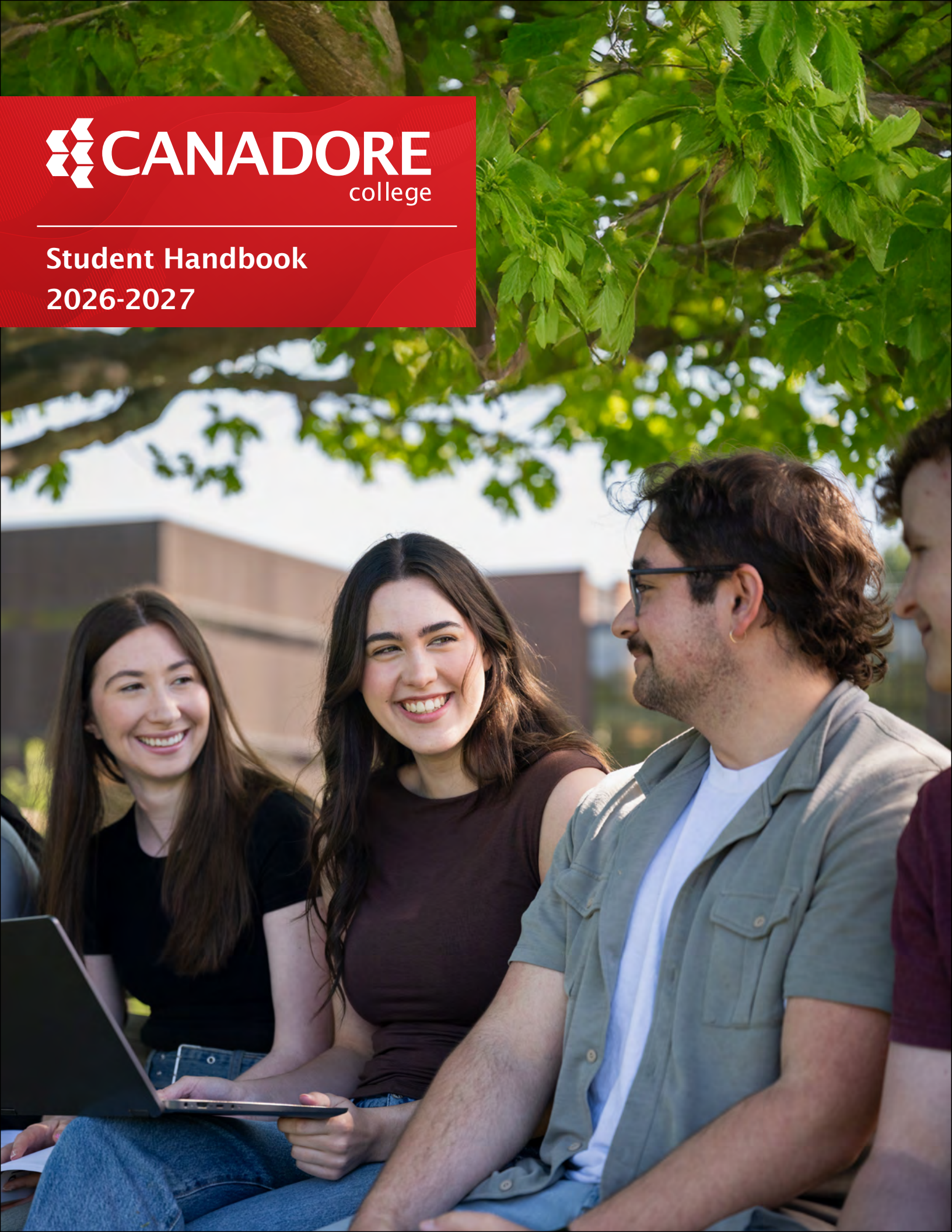


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Land Acknowledgement

College Drive Gymnasium

There are three (3) Help Alarm Buttons in the women's change room:

one (1) in the showers,
one (1) in the washroom, and
one (1) in the locker area.

There is one (1) button in the men's change room.

There is one (1) Help Alarm Button each in the following areas: cafeteria, men's & women's bathroom, two (2) in the hangar, west and east walls, and men's & women's change rooms on second floor (1).

Internal Emergency Phones

College Drive Campus

There are three (3) Internal Emergency Phones located in Canadore's Hewgill Hall on the first, second and third floors beside rooms D120, D231 & D340.

Three (3) Internal Emergency Phones are located across from the elevators in the Nipissing University "A" block on the first, second and third floors.

Four (4) Internal Emergency Phones are located across from the elevators in the Nipissing University "H" block on the basement, first, second and third floors.

Commerce Court Campus

Two (2) Internal Emergency Phones are located at Commerce Court Campus on the first floor near E132, and one on the second floor near E228.

Canadore Assessment and Care Team (A.C.T.)

Canadore A.C.T. supports a safe campus environment by evaluating and responding to potential threats. The team supports the well-being of students, employees and the entire college community.

The team is comprised of members from:

- The Academic Area
- The First Peoples' Centre
- Health, Safety and Environmental
- Residence
- Security
- Student Services

Canadore College has formed a multi-disciplinary violence, risk and threat assessment team which will function as a group evaluative tool to review and assess behaviours of individuals that may be perceived by the college community as concerning, violent and/or behaviours that pose a potential risk to others.

This team will provide a forum for identifying and providing an ongoing review of individual behaviours that are of a concerning nature. The team is designed, in its membership, to cover a diverse cross section of the college community which will collect and comment on the information presented regarding the behaviours of individuals identified and, through review, will determine action plans to manage the behaviours in a proactive manner. These action plans will include the implementation of related policies and procedures, identification of potential risks to college community and business operations, and mitigation strategies to alleviate risks.

Parking Services

Paid parking is in effect on all campuses in North Bay, 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. There is no fee for parking at the West Parry Sound Campus.

A parking permit is for use of marked parking spaces only and does not guarantee the availability of a parking space but constitutes a license to park on College property.

Hourly and daily rates are available to visitors at a cost payable at the HONK Mobile App. Visitor parking is located at the entrance of College Drive Lot 4, Aviation Lot 24, and Commerce Court Lot 26.

The College is located on private property. The College is under no legal obligation to provide parking and, therefore, is not responsible for loss or damage to vehicles while parked on campus. The College maintains the right to tow vehicles off the property.

No one may transfer a permit to another person without attending the Campus Security Office and having the new permit holder complete an application.

Bicycles may park in provided racks only. Bicycles found chained to trees, posts, etc. will be removed by the maintenance department and Campus Security will be notified.

Public Transit

Included with your Digital ID student card, North Bay Transit is now operating Dynamic Dispatching at our North Bay campuses and across the City of North Bay. This convenient public transit booking and tracking system is now offered between 7:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m., Monday through Friday, and 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Saturday.

Rides must be booked before 11:00 p.m. on Monday to Friday and before 9:00 p.m. on Saturdays to allow for pick-up and drop-off before the end of the transit service.

How to Book a Trip

- Select your payment option (Digital ID pass, cash or transfer);
- The app will let you know when to expect your ride and where to wait;
- Watch your bus arrive in real time via the app; and

Learning and Transitional Support Services

The transition to college can bring new opportunities, expectations, and challenges. Learning and Transitional Support Services help students build the skills, confidence, and strategies needed to succeed academically and personally.

Learning Support Appointments

Meet one-on-one with a Learning and Transition Support Coordinator to receive support with:

- Time management and organization.
- Study skills and learning strategies.
- Note-taking techniques.
- Goal setting and academic planning.
- Navigating college resources and supports.
- Appointments can be booked through iSucceed.

Academic Skills Workshops

Interactive workshops are offered throughout the academic year to help students strengthen their academic skills and confidence.

Topics may include:

- Effective studying and test preparation.
- Time management and organization.
- Strategic note-taking.
- Reducing procrastination.
- Academic success strategies.

Peer Tutoring

Peer Tutoring provides students with an opportunity to receive academic support from trained peer tutors. While tutoring availability varies by subject and course, every effort is made to connect students with appropriate support.

Information about tutoring services and tutor requests is available through the Student Success Services website.

International Student Support

International students can access guidance, resources, and programming designed to support their transition to college life and living in Canada.

First Generation Student Support

Students who are the first in their family to attend post-secondary education can access additional guidance, resources, and support to help navigate the college experience and build a strong foundation for success.

Accessible Learning Services

Accessible Learning Services supports students with permanent, temporary, and episodic disabilities by providing academic accommodations and services that promote equitable access to education.

In accordance with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) and the Ontario Human Rights Code, accommodations are designed to reduce disability-related barriers while maintaining academic standards and essential learning outcomes.

Student Experience

Academic Accommodations

Students seeking academic accommodations must register with Accessible Learning Services and provide appropriate documentation of their disability-related needs.

Once approved, students will receive a Letter of Accommodation (LOA) outlining their approved accommodations.

Accommodations are individualized and may include:

- Extended time for tests and examinations.
- Alternative format course materials.
- Assistive technology and adaptive equipment.
- Note-taking supports.
- Reduced-distraction testing environments.
- Other accommodations that support equitable access to learning.

Students are encouraged to connect with Accessible Learning Services as early as possible to discuss their needs and access available supports. Early registration helps ensure accommodations are in place and provides students with the tools, resources, and guidance needed to successfully navigate their college experience.

Psycho-Educational Assessment Referrals

Students who suspect they may have a learning disability or other disability-related barrier and do not have current documentation may be eligible for a referral for a psycho-educational assessment. Assessment results can help identify learning strengths and challenges and support accommodation planning.

Stay Strong: Accessible Learning Summer Transition Program

Start Strong is a summer transition program designed for incoming students with disabilities. The program introduces students to academic expectations, campus resources, self-advocacy skills, and the supports available through Accessible Learning Services.

Mental Health and Wellbeing Supports

The transition to post-secondary education can bring new opportunities, challenges, and stressors. Mental Health and Wellbeing Services support students in maintaining their wellbeing, building resilience, and navigating personal, emotional, and mental health concerns that may affect their academic success and overall student experience.

Students can access a range of supports and services, including:

- Brief assessments and consultations.
- Short-term counselling support.
- Mental health navigation and resource coordination.
- Referrals to campus and community services.
- Wellness workshops and educational programming.

Peer support through the CARES (Campus Allies for Resilience, Empowerment, and Support) program.

Mental Health and Wellbeing Services are designed to help students identify concerns, develop coping strategies, strengthen resilience, and connect with appropriate resources and supports.

Students are encouraged to seek support early, whether they are experiencing challenges themselves or would benefit from additional guidance during their college journey.

Experiential Learning

Experiential Learning (EL) is 'learning by doing.' David Kolb's Experiential Learning Cycle is most commonly used to describe the experiential learning process. Learners have an experience, engage in reflection about the experience, think abstractly about conclusions and applications from reflections, and apply the learning through active experimentation.

EL at Canadore provides students with hands-on experience in real and/or simulated work environments. Whether an EL opportunity occurs at the College, in the community, or within a field-related workplace or industry, the purpose of these opportunities is to better prepare students for the workforce. EL opportunities will enrich your student experience and provide you with valuable exposure to potential employers and careers.



Examples of EL:

- Work/Field Placement
- Clinical Placement
- Service Learning
- Workplace/Lab Simulation
- Applied/Industry Sponsored Research
- Formal Course Projects
- Capstone Projects
- Job Shadow
- Performance/Artistic Production
- Internships
- Incubators/Entrepreneurial Activities
- Co-curricular Involvement Activities

For some EL activities, students will be required to complete/obtain Non-Academic Requirements (e.g., communicable disease screening, police vulnerable sector check, etc.) to be eligible to proceed with the experience. Students will be advised of any Non-Academic Requirements through program-specific materials contained within the program Student Success Guide, through

Canadore's placement website, and as directed by faculty and/or a placement coordination staff.

Students participating in a placement shall engage in reflective self-assessment regarding their fitness to practice at the beginning of each shift. These self-assessments support ongoing readiness, professionalism, and safety for all involved (self, colleagues, clients, etc.) in placement experiences. In some professions, a self-assessment is an ongoing professional obligation. Students are encouraged to speak with their course faculty regarding daily self-assessments and should not proceed with a placement shift if there are concerns about fitness to practice.

Canadore International

Canadore International has a team of International Student Advisors and is the College's hub for supporting international students. Canadore International also guides domestic students on study abroad opportunities, welcomes visiting international exchange students, and coordinates faculty exchanges.

Canadore International hosts a full suite of engagement, settlement, and advising programming on a yearly basis with international students as its primary audience. Examples of settlement programming include in-person workshops on matters such as housing, transportation and banking, job search/career programming workshops that touch on matters such as resume development and job search best practices for international students, and orientation programming (pre-departure and arrival sessions) for every semester. In addition, Canadore International maintains a specialized program to match domestic and international students for reciprocal cultural learning (our Twinning Program).

Summary of Services:

- International Student Advising - providing guidance and advice to ensure that students understand and follow the laws and regulations relating to their study permits.
- Host international cultural events for all students including Diwali, Lunar New Year, and Ramadan.
- Administer International Student Health Insurance Plan - advising international students on health insurance plan inclusion and exclusion.
- Communicate with international students through the iCent App, which includes useful features such as newsletters, frequently asked questions, important dates and deadlines, financial aid information, employment, health plan information, etc.

Campus Bookstore/The Campus Shop

The Campus Bookstore is your go-to shop for course textbooks, learning packs, and Canadore swag to show off your Panther pride. The bookstore is located at the College Drive Campus, however, you can place an order online and have it delivered directly to your home.

For textbooks, there are new, used, and digital options available.

Note: If your course requires courseware or online resources, please select new as there is no guarantee that codes will still be in a used book.

There is often an option to rent or buy. Renting is a good option if the book will not be needed for more than one term. Rental accounts can be set-up online. It is recommended that students place their orders online.

There is a buyback program available to students. The amount offered is based on the demand for the book as well as the condition of the book.

A student card and a debit card are required to complete any transaction.

What is the Village?

The Village is a Centre of Excellence in Healthy aging. This world-class health and wellness facility is located in at 100 College Drive campus in North Bay. The only model of its kind in Canada, the facility is focused on collaborative interprofessional education and the integration of Indigenous, Eastern and Western healing and wellness practices. The Village integrates seniors on campus, creating an intergenerational space, where students and seniors learn with each other. The outcome is a reduction in the risk for social isolation, improved well-being, and a place where everyone is welcome. The Village offers over 60 student-led or student supported activities for Seniors at no cost. All activities support healthy aging, in the areas of physical activity, social connections, lifelong learning and technology support. Over 800 seniors per month engage in programming with students from a variety of programs from our Schools of Indigenous Studies, Human Care, Health Science and Social Services, and Sport and Recreation. In addition, The Village offers a comprehensive suite of student-run clinics, including general health, dental hygiene, safe mobility, cognitive stimulation, early childhood education, as well as specialized Indigenous classrooms and ceremonial areas. The Village continues to educate and train the next generation of health and wellness professionals. Theory delivered in the classroom seamlessly becomes practical experience in student-led activities and clinics. The next phase at The Village includes a long-term care facility on campus. Future plans also include intergenerational living opportunities for seniors and students and an affordable assisted living facility.

Academic Integrity

What is Academic Integrity?

The International Center for Academic Integrity (2021) defines academic integrity as a commitment to five fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, and responsibility. They believe that these five values, plus the courage to act on them even in the face of adversity, are truly foundational to the academy. Without them, everything that we do in our capacities as teachers, learners, and researchers loses value and becomes suspect.

An academic integrity breach can include transgressions such as cheating, falsification, impersonation, contract cheating, and inappropriate collaboration. It is important to be familiar with all possible offences and to know how to avoid them.

Canadore's Academic Integrity Policy details what constitutes a breach of academic integrity and what disciplinary action will be taken depending on the nature of the breach.

Faculty members may permit or prohibit the use of Generative Artificial Intelligence tools (i.e., ChatGPT) in each class. Students are advised to review their courses' Section Specific Information, and/or consult with their instructor, to learn about whether Generative Artificial Intelligence may be used for classroom learning.

Program Navigation

Coordinators and Academic Advisors

Registered students will be notified of the name and contact information of their Program Coordinator and Academic Advisor.

Program Coordinators are responsible to:

- Monitor student progress and meet with students on academic intervention/academic probation to prepare individual learning plans, engaging the Dean (as needed).
- Lead and coordinate student progress meetings which discuss student academic, practical, and behavioral performance.
- Advise and assist students with academic issues and concerns when they cannot be resolved at a faculty level.
- Provide academic advisement on program transfer/exit options, and graduation requirements.

Academic Advisors are responsible to:

- Provide academic advice on:
 - adding or dropping courses to a semester course load.
 - applying for course substitutions and exemptions.
 - articulation opportunities and further studies.
- Monitor student progress and develop individual learning plans, engaging the Program Coordinator (as needed).

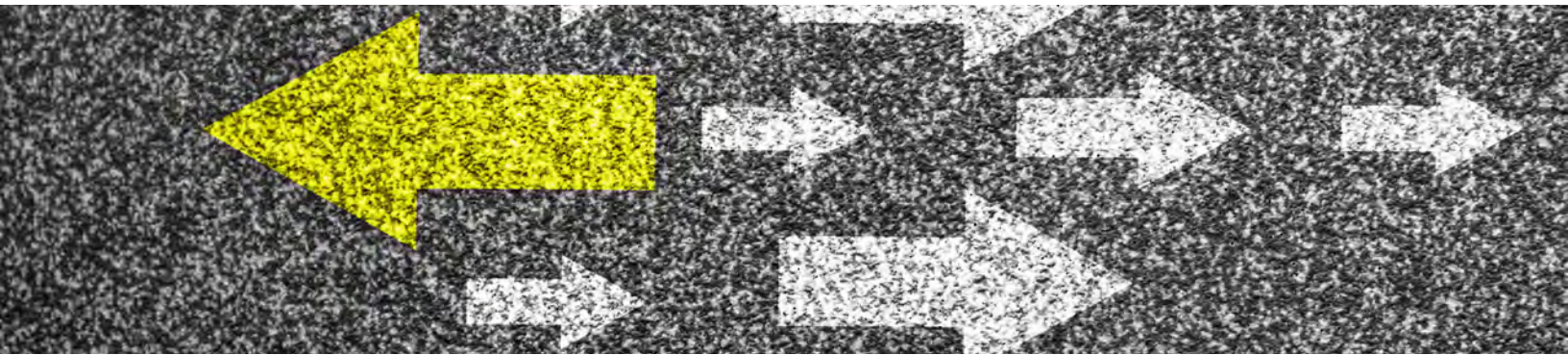
Credit Transfer and Pathways

If you have come to Canadore from another college or university, you may be able to transfer some of your previously earned credits! If you are beginning a second program within Canadore some of your previous classes may be transferable too. Additionally, after you graduate, you may want to pursue another credential at another institution and there's support for that as well!

Summary of Services:

- Assist with the Credit Transfer Application.
- Support through Advanced Standing process.
- PLAR – Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition.
- Provide Pathway Partners – other postsecondary institutions that have signed formal agreements with Canadore.
- Recommend other resources such as ONTransfer.ca (connects students to transfer opportunities within Ontario).
- Students may receive transfer credit or prior learning assessment and recognition (PLAR) credits for up to a maximum of 75% of their prescribed Canadore College program curriculum.

Course Add/Drop

Students may add or drop courses through the Admissions Office using the [Online Add/Drop Form](#).

Extra course fees will apply for additional courses (above the normal course load for the session). Part-time students will be expected to pay for courses at the time of registration.

Students who are on Academic Probation may have additional restrictions placed on course registration/enrolment. Please refer to the program coordinator and/or the academic advisor of the program with any questions.

By adding/dropping courses, the student's status (full-time/part-time) may be affected. For students receiving financial aid, a status change may affect the student's entitlement. (It is the student's responsibility to consult with the Financial Aid Office for clarification.)

Students are advised to contact their program coordinator to discuss changes to their course load. Normally, this is done prior to submission of the Online Add/Drop Form and by the registration or deadline dates for the semester. See [Important Dates and Deadlines](#).

Requests for adding a course will be processed only if space is available, applicable pre-requisites are met, and no timetable conflicts exist when received for processing in the Admissions Office.

Note: A course may be repeated in the case of a failure or to improve competency or upgrade a mark. However, the original mark remains on the student record.

Academic Records

What are Academic Records?

Your academic record reflects your academic achievements. You may need it to apply for a job or to another college or university. Your name as it appears on your **STU-View record** will be printed on your credential and transcript. It is in your best interest to ensure your record is correct (e.g., proper spelling of your name).

The Office of the Registrar performs the following to assist you:

- Processes student grades and academic standing when these are received from the academic faculties.
- Computes grade points and grade point averages.
- Produces transcripts.
- Grants diplomas, certificates and degrees.

Your records (personal information) are the property of the College. The College is bound by the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (2002). Only you (or someone with your written permission) can view and obtain a copy of your records. To protect your confidentiality and the College's liability, you must provide written consent for a third party to access or discuss personal information held by the College.

Transcripts and Credentials

What is a Transcript?

An official transcript is a detailed record of your academic history at Canadore College that includes an authorized signature.

Canadore is using a new Canadian digital credential platform called MyCreds™ to issue academic documents electronically. MyCreds™ provides fast and easy access to request and send your transcripts and credentials to academic institutions, employers, government offices and more, anytime, anywhere.

How do I order my eTranscript?

Fill out a Transcript Request form. Canadore College will process the request and you will be sent an email letting you know when it is available. We process transcripts daily in order of request received.

Technology Support

iLearn (D2L)

iLearn is the name of Canadore's Learning Management System (LMS).

iLearn provides access to course content, your grades and feedback, and may contain additional course activities and course resources (as uploaded by your instructor). Although you may have classes entirely or partially face-to-face or in the classroom, there will still be resources available to you through iLearn.

It is important to access iLearn often and download/use the Brightspace Pulse App to receive updates and notifications.
