Subject: Coming to Canada: Financial Considerations

Aside from your tuition, ancillary and incidental fees associated with your program, there are several other financial factors to consider:

Books and supplies:	\$1,800CAD/per year of	
	study	
Residence/Housing:	<pre>\$8,040CAD/per year of study *see note about off- campus housing →</pre>	For off-campus housing, you may need to sign a 12 month lease. You can expect the cost of off-campus housing to be equal or at a higher monthly rate than living on campus. If you have a 12 month lease, you can expect to add an additional \$3600CAD or more to the \$8040.
Clothing:	\$1,500CAD /per year of study	
Food and entertainment:	\$2,500CAD /per year of study	
Laptop:	\$1000CAD/per year of study	
Childcare:	\$5500 per child /per year of study	If you have more than one child, please multiple this number by the number of children you have.
Transportation:	<pre>\$2200/per year of study *see note about this expense →</pre>	Unfortunately, buses are not available in Parry Sound. You can walk or you can take a taxi. A one-way trip from one end of Parry Sound to the other by taxi is quoted at approximately \$15CAD. For North Bay campus students, the bus pass is included in your ancillary fees for the Fall 2024 intake; however, if you need to take a taxi for any reason, this could cost approximately \$45 one-way. If you are driving, you will need to consider the cost of gas which could cost approximately \$50CAD-\$150CAD per week depending on your vehicle and driving distance. In addition to the cost of your vehicle lease.

**note that all fees are approximates and may be more depending on your own personal situation or fee increases.
