WHO WE ARE

The Village Collective Impact Project is a Collective of 50 partner organizations that supported over 30,000 Seniors this season. We have a community network of 87 organizations representing 13 sectors across our region.

OUR GOAL

To reduce the risk of social isolation among Seniors and Indigenous Seniors 60+ by improving community connectedness to increase social awareness and participation by seniors, families and caregivers, using an intergenerational approach.


Seniors Connected
