### **Traditional Drumming**

For Canadian Indigenous Peoples, the drum is not simply a musical instrument. The drum is representative of Mother Earth's heartbeat.

It is used for ceremonial purposes as well as for social settings. Many Indigenous nations and communities across Canada have their own drum. There are numerous variations of the drum, including the "grandfather" drum, the hand drum, and the water drum.


The most common place you would find the drum is at a Pow Wow. Pow Wows are gatherings and celebrations where drumming, singing and dancing take place and are generally open for everyone to attend.

For many Indigenous nations, drumming and singing is a form of prayer. We will often have a song to open up a ceremony, gathering or event in a positive way. Some of the songs consist of chanting, with some containing words in our Indigenous languages. There are social songs, and others that are for more specific ceremonial purposes





With a population of approximately 52,000.

























# **Your Social Insurance Number**

The Social Insurance Number (SIN) is a nine-digit number that is required to work in Canada.

#### Are you new to Canada and need a SIN?

- 1. Apply for your SIN online at sin-nas.canada.ca.
- 2. You will receive an email confirming your application with a SIN Application Number (SAN).
- 3. Within 5 business days you will receive a second email confirming that your application has been processed.
- 4. Go to My Service Canada Account (MSCA) to register for an account. You will need your SAN and your unique client identifier, from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada.

a. Follow the verification steps to create your profile; and

b. Secure your account by registering for multi-factor authentication.

Once you have successfully created your MSCA, you can view your SIN in the secure portal.

#### What do I need to apply?

To apply for a SIN, you must provide identity documents:

1. An original valid primary identity document that proves your identity and your legal status in Canada. such as:





A Permanent Resident Card or a Confirmation of Permanent Residence, issued by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC):



the permit holder "may accept employment" or "may work" in Canada, issued by IRCC; or a visitor record showing that

A work permit; or

a study permit,

which indicates



A diplomatic identity card and a work authorization, issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development.

2. An original valid secondary document to confirm your identity, such as a passport or a provincial or territorial identification issued by a Canadian Government (federal, provincial, or territorial). Examples:

you are authorized to work in

Canada, issued by IRCC; or





A passport. (Canadian or foreign)



A single journey travel document



A provincial or territorial health card or driver's license

# **Your Social Insurance Number**

#### **Protecting your SIN**

Your SIN is confidential. Do **not** use it as identification or provide it for job applications, rental applications, etc.

In the wrong hands, your SIN could lead to:

- · an invasion of privacy
- identity theft
- · loss of government benefits, tax refunds or bank credits

If someone uses your SIN to commit fraud, it could ruin your credit rating. Someone could also use your SIN to work illegally. In this case, the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) may expect you to pay tax on income you did not receive.

#### When to provide your SIN

Your SIN is confidential. The most commons uses of your SIN is:

#### when you are hired for a job and begin working

 Employers must collect your SIN to report your income to the government for tax and social benefits purposes

#### when dealing with the government for certain transactions

- · You need to provide your SIN to:
  - file your taxes
  - access programs and benefits like employment insurance, student loans and grants, and public pensions

## when you open an account that earns interest income at a bank or other financial institution

 Financial institutions must collect your SIN to report your income (such as interest and dividends) to the government for tax purposes

For the lists of federal programs that are permitted to collect and disclose the SIN consult The <u>Social Insurance Number Code of Practice</u> (<a href="https://www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/sin/reports/code-of-practice.html#h2.1">https://www.canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/sin/reports/code-of-practice.html#h2.1</a>)

#### When not to provide your SIN

Some businesses may ask for your SIN. This is strongly discouraged, but not illegal.

For example, you do not have to provide your SIN:

#### when you apply for a job

 Employers don't need your SIN until they hire you for the job and you begin working and earning income

#### when dealing with non-government entities for most transactions

- · You don't need to provide your SIN to:
  - o rent a property, fill out a rental application, or negotiate a lease
  - sign up for telecommunication services (like phone, internet, or cable services);
     an exception is Hydro Quebec, which must collect the SIN by provincial law
  - o rent a car
  - o complete a medical history questionnaire
  - write a last will and testament
  - o apply for post-secondary education

## when you perform general banking transactions and for financial transactions that don't earn you interest income

- · You don't need to provide your SIN to:
  - o apply for a credit card
  - o apply for or renew a mortgage
  - o apply for a loan or line of credit
  - o cash a cheque

#### when you request a credit report

- You don't need to provide your SIN to get a credit report
- Offer to provide other documents instead of your SIN for identification purposes or for credit purposes

#### What to do if someone asks for your SIN when it's not required

If someone asks for your SIN, ask questions. Ask why they need it, ask how they will use it, and ask who else will receive it. Explain that your SIN is not required by law and that you do not want to provide it. Offer to use a different proof of identity.






# **Important Dates and Deadlines**

- Select the Support tab, Important Dates and Deadlines, and then the term you would like to view.







- Last day to withdraw or add courses
  - September 15 without academic penalty.
- Fee due dates
  - First year fee estimates are located on page 2 of your LOA, the website is the source of approved fees. If you are a returning upper-year student, you will receive a fee statement and reminder a few months prior to your next registration.
- Grades
  - Official grades are posted to your Self-Service account at the dates denoted on the important dates and deadlines pages. Once final grades are released, final credential audit processes begin.
- Convocation dates
  - Also posted on the Important Dates and Deadlines pages.

- Check your student account to ensure your fees are paid. Your account must be in good standing to register, receive letters and documents.

## WHAT THE POLICE DO

- Community Engagement and Crime Reduction Officer.
- Public Speaking on various topics from social media awareness and safety to visiting elementary schools

# 911 & WHEN TO USE IT

- •To Report a crime in progress or about to occur
- •For a situation when serious injury can occur
- •Suspicious activity
- •To report a fire
- •When an ambulance is required
- •If you need police assistance but it does NOT fall into those categories then the number to call is 705-472-1234.

## WHAT IF I DIAL 911 BY ACCIDENT?

- •Am I in trouble????? NO
- •Will this affect my future VISA applications????? NO IT WILL NOT
- What do I do?
  - •If you hung up after hearing a dispatcher call back on the non-emergency line 705-472-1234.
  - •If you receive a call from NO CALLER ID shortly after, answer it, it is our dispatchers trying to ensure everything is ok and you are SAFE
  - •The dispatchers will have questions for you, answer them as best you can.
  - •If we are unable to reach you by phone, an officer will have to attend your residence to ensure your safety which takes up a lot of police resources.

## PREVENT ACCIDENTAL 911 DIALS

- •Complications due to India's country code being 91
- •Be certain of your dialing
- •Disengage automatic emergency on phone so that once 9-1-1 are dialed it does not automatically call the emergency line without pushing send
- •2024, January 1 to August 9.
  - •3500 accidental 911 calls
  - •425 where people stayed on line and answered questions so that no further investigative steps were taken to ensure their safety.
- •If you dial 1-1-2 you will be automatically directed to 9-1-1

## PEDESTRIAN ROAD SAFETY



- •Be alert
- At lights, ensure traffic stopped and pedestrian symbol is lit.
- •Use designated crossing spots when crossing the street when available
- •Try to make eye contact with drivers in stopped vehicles to ensure that they see you before crossing in front of them
- •At night, wear light and reflective coloured clothing so that drivers can see you
- If you are wearing earphones, make sure that you can still hear the traffic around you
- •Do NOT walk on highway!




