Disaster Action Team: Our DAT responders arrive in the immediate aftermath of disasters to offer financial assistance, food, and hygienic supplies to victims of home fires and other manmade and natural disasters.

Disaster Duty Officer: Our eyes and ears in the sky, the duty officer activates and supports Disaster Action Team responders from afar when disaster strikes.

Disaster Mental Health: Processing tragedy can seem like an impossibly tall order. Our DMH specialists are trained professionals who help victims with their psychosocial and emotional needs.

Information and Planning: The brains behind the operation, our Information and Planning specialists analyze, contextualize, and distribute data to our responders in the field.

Mass Care Sheltering/Feeding: When large numbers of people are on the move and need refuge, our Shelter and Feeding workers come to the rescue and create a safe place where folks can rest their heads and put food in their stomachs.

Mass Care Reunification: When large disasters tear families and friends apart, our Reunification specialists jump into the fray to bring loved ones back together.

Recovery Casework: Our caseworkers help victims of disasters get back on their feet after the dust settles by offering reassurance and guiding them to recovery resources.
