5.1 ACGC Academic Career Guidance Counselling

The ACGC focuses on preparing cycle 3 students for a successful transition to high school. Various exercises will be geared towards helping students develop ideas about their future career path. Grade 5 students will be tasked with leading an interview with their parents to ask

them about their employment. Grade 6 students will participate in multiple workshops led by experts to help them prepare for life in high school. Topics covered will be daily schedules, taking notes, and understanding what the high school experience is like. Additionally, students will explore the concept of friendship and how it evolves across time and through the transition from elementary to high school with the guidance of their grade 6 teachers.

5.2 Sexuality education program

Interim Principal Laetitia Kachmar provided an overview of the Edinburgh sexuality education program. The sexuality education program details what content is being taught at each grade level. The program design is oriented toward respecting boundaries and empowering students with knowledge. Students in cycle 3 will explore the concepts of friendship and the complexities of emotions. A professional healthcare provider will visit grade 4 students to discuss the biological process of sexual development. It is worthy to note that this is the final year that the school is responsible for the curating the sexuality education program. The concept of sexuality will be integrated into the *Culture et citoyenneté Québécoise* (CCQ) curriculum which is under direct supervision of the MELS.

Interim Principal Laetitia Kachmar reports that there is a possibility of assigning an Edinburgh administrative professional to curate the school's library collection and provide a much-valued and appreciated service to the staff and students.

Interim Principal Laetitia Kachmar reports on the past, current, and future events at Edinburgh. Students' participation in their science fair was excellent. Many thanks to M. El-Hama for directing a wonderful edition of the science fair. Edinburgh's storytelling competition captured students' attention and resulted in the nomination of two top storytellers. These two winning competitors received a special invite to tell their stories at Willingdon Elementary at the final schoolboard-wide storytelling competition. Interim principal Kachmar wishes to congratulate the Edinburgh storytellers. Recently grade 6 students visited the holocaust museum in Montreal to understand the significance of the Holocaust and reflect on the importance of remembrance.

In other topics interim principal Kachmar reports that the students are enjoying the new climbing wall in the gym. A special event at Edinburgh will consist of a visit from our highly talented Edinburgh alumni Jordan Sugar. Jordan Sugar is a student at Rosemount High School. It is worthy to note that Rosemount HS was recently recognized by the MELS as the only English language high school to offer the 'Art études' music program. Jordan will be performing for all

students in the gym during the next assembly. On April 26 Edinburgh's physical education expert teacher Mr. Cho will be facilitating another fun filled Jump Rope for Heart campaign. Best of luck to all the students and staff as they raise funds for the Heart & Stroke Foundation
