

École Dunrae Gardens Marches to Protest Climate Change

On Friday, September 27, the streets of Town of Mount Royal rang out with the sounds of students from École Dunrae Gardens Elementary School. Students from Kindergarten to Grade 6 marched, homemade signs in hand, through their neighbourhood as they added their voices to the Montreal Climate Change Protest. This is the second climate march for this school community dedicated to protecting the environment. On April 23, the students held an Earth Day Climate March, walking the neighborhood with signs made of mainly reused materials demanding adults better protect the planet.

The school is following up its marches with action. In the spring of 2019, the Grade 6 students at Dunrae completed a school wide waste audit in order to learn more about the waste that the school generated and where it went. Part of the school's STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) program, the objective of the project was to identify opportunity for waste diversion and award good waste diversion behaviour. Awards were given out to the classes that generated the least amount of landfill waste and that had the least amount of contamination in their recycling bin, as well as to the classes that improved their recycling over a two-month period. One Grade 2 class raised their recycling rate from 60% to 93%! The waste audit also identified the need for composting; 31% of school waste is compostable but currently gets thrown



out as regular trash and ends up in the landfill – that is approximately 1900 kg per year. The students are doing their part, with the help of their teachers and school administrators. With the collaboration of the Town of Mount Royal, the school hopes to introduce composting this fall.

Dunrae Garden's participation in climate marches and its initiatives to improve recycling and conservation are aligned with the school's principles of "academic excellence, community, global awareness

and respect for oneself and others." With its vibrant school spirit and strong academic curriculum, the school welcomed a large Kindergarten cohort this Fall, students who have now already been introduced to environmental action.
