6.1: Commissioner Susan Pereira.

- 1) Budget cuts by government BOD will meet to distribute budget cuts throughout the system. BOD will give us information on how new allocation will be done.
- 2) Annual report (mostly for high schools) 95.9% graduation rate achievement for our school board one of the highest scores ever achieved. Target 92%
- 3) Building Process document submitted
- 4) January 24<sup>th</sup> Supreme Court of Canada EMSB challenging Bill 21
- 5) Bill 40 heard by Supreme court of Canada announcement to be made (school boards continuing to manage their institutions) – Bill 40 would make school boards into a service center – EMSB fighting to keep this right.

# 1. Budget Cuts Announcement

CAQ government announced \$200M in education sector budget cuts. EMSB's share: \$2.6M, to be implemented by the end of March. Board department directors will determine how to implement cuts based on Ministry criteria. Revised budget to be presented for adoption in March. **No impact on pedagogical budgets** – previously adopted or presented GB budgets remain unaffected.

### 2. EMSB Annual Report & Success Rate

Council approved the **2023-2024 EMSB Annual Report** on February 4th. EMSB achieved a **95.9% success rate** – highest in its history and compared to other boards, service centers, and private schools.

Difficult to maintain or surpass this rate; target set at **92% graduation rate**.

### 3. Budget Consultation & School Priorities

Council approved the **budget building process document** for consultation. **Consultation package** to be sent to GBs and the Parents Committee. **Action required:** GBs must discuss funding priorities and provide input. **Delegates** should bring school priorities to the Parents Committee to inform overall budget priorities.

### 4. Supreme Court Challenge – Bill 21

January 23, 2025: Supreme Court of Canada announced it will hear a challenge to Bill 21. EMSB remains at the forefront of this legal challenge. Basis of challenge: Right to manage/control institutions & against discrimination.

5. Court Challenge – Bill 40 Court of Appeal has heard the challenge on Bill 40. Awaiting decision – no timeline provided.

#### Item 8.1 Parent Commissioner Report

The last Council meeting was last Monday February 4, 2025

- A group of young women from JFK High school were awarded the student of the month award for their Shoe Box Project, 125 boxes filled with personal items delivered to women's shelters in the city. A wonderful initiative.
- The Quebec government has established a complaint system whereby there are regional ombudsmen. Our region's ombudsperson provided a report and gave a presentation on the process and results of her first years' experience.
- The annual report was presented and approved by Council. Also, some of the key results such as graduation rates and success in standardized exams were presented as part of the Commitment to Success plan. The annual report is either on the EMSB website or will be soon.
- It was the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz last week. The DG and Chair talked about the importance of Holocaust education, thanked Federation CJA and the Holocaust Museum for supporting the EMSB's work. I also pointed out that in addition to 6 million Jews, 5 million non-Jews were killed, among the total over ¼ million people killed just because they were handicapped or disabled in some way. The dehumanization and marginalization of any group within society can result in unthinkable acts. We must teach our children well.
- Also reported by the DG and chair:
  - Kindergarten registration has started. There is now an online site to register and EMSB has been running ads.
    There were many references to the budget cuts and, of course, a commitment to ensuring that students will not bear the brunt. But it is profoundly upsetting and angering.
- The calendars were ratified.
- Budget building instructions and documentation was approved, and materials were sent out yesterday to Governing Boards.
