6. New Business

6.1 Student Handbook/Code of Conduct

- Mr. Spilak presented the updated student handbook/code of conduct, highlighting changes from the previous year's version; noted that the term "Community Service" has been changed to "Service as Action".
- Mr. Ursino asked whether exceptions (i.e. children with special needs) should be included with the timetable. Ms. Celzi responded that exceptions are handled on an individual basis

between the school and the individual student's family. Mr. Spilak also noted that the school is open earlier than class start time, therefore, students are encouraged to arrive early.

- Ms. Passucci asked if the school's cell phone policy aligns with the new policy established by the Provincial Government. Ms. Celzi noted that the school's policy is over and above the government policy. It aims to change students' behaviours, as the dependence on phones is a distraction in the classroom. Exceptions will be made for students who require a phone for medical reasons.
- Ms. Passucci asked about how potential theft of cell phones from lockers will be mitigated. Ms. Caya responded that lockers are constantly monitored to ensure that they are locked, Mr. Spilak added that detentions are handed out to students whose lockers are found unlocked.

ADDENDUM to Meeting Minutes

1. Student Report

English Montreal Student Advisory Committee (EMSAC)

EMSAC met last on April 16th, at FACE. During the meeting, members approved a bilingual statement expressing the committee's opposition to Bill 21, which bans teachers from wearing religious symbols. It has since been sent to Premier Francois Legault, Justice Minister Simon Jolin-Barrette & Education Minister Bernard Drainville. There is also the possibility that it eventually could be sent to members of the Opposition, and even a few Federal politicians. Members of the Subcommittee which wrote the statement are at tonight's board meeting to present it to the council of commissioners, as well as to the general public.

Other topics discussed during our last meeting included finding ways to promote our committee, so that the student population of the EMSB is aware of our work. An Instagram account has been created (@emsbstudentadvisory), so feel free to check it out to see our members in action.

EMSAC is set to meet next on May 14th at John F. Kennedy High School, which is likely to be the final meeting of the academic year.

House Council

CJE Service at LMAC

Our school has partnered with our local Carrefour Jeunesse Emploi to help secondary 3,4 & 5 students with CV writing, job searches, mock interviews and more. Monica Lara Celaya is a psychosocial worker that will be at LMAC providing this service. She will be in our school every Thursday from 10am-3pm. She will be available to meet with students between those times, including lunchtime. To schedule appointments with her, students must contact her directly via text or email. Her contact information can be found in the CLC and Guidance areas. As a result of our collaboration with CJE, we have received a \$1,000 grant. This funding will be utilized to establish an entirely new Social Justice Committee, comprising various subcommittees.
