Moderation Defined - School marks obtained by each group of students are compared to the marks they obtained on the uniform examination. Using a statistical calculation, the school marks of each group are adjusted by the ministry to correspond to the marks obtained by this group on the uniform examination. The calculation takes into account the two following factors: the mean and the standard deviation (the distribution of marks around the mean).
