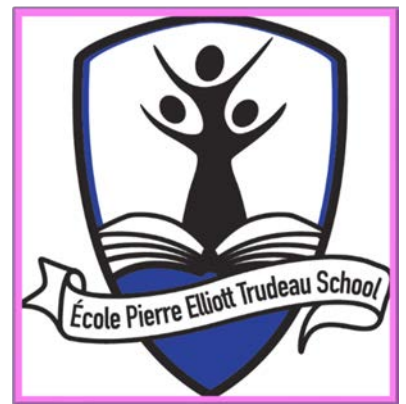

Dearest Parents & Guardians,
