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4.2 Covid update (15 minutes)

- 4.3 Enrolment (5 minutes)

• How does the registration compare to previous years currently? Enrolment at 507. Iammarrone re-explained factors that could have affected enrolment. Room for growth due to the 9 classes in the basement (approximately 20 students per class=180). There are many factors that can affect enrolment e.g., increase in temporary foreign workers in Montreal, word of mouth has historically been good promoting factors, etc.

- 5. Reports (25 minutes)
 - 5.1 Principal's Report
 - WPS allocated 2 Pre-K (K4) classes for 2022-2023
 - Black History Month being celebrated at WPS:
 - Schoolwide historical timelines that cover approximately 400 years and 15 steps.
 Will cover the tribulations, accomplishments, and contributions of the Black community. Classrooms will either create a door mural, mural, or class project which other students will get to see/visit which will allow them to learn from one another.
 - A book and read aloud activity where students can contribute to a discussion. Ask questions, reflect, and share ideas.
 - o Black History Month presentation from Youth stars.
 - o Spiritual Animator will be doing classroom presentations as well.

Author Ms. Akilah Newton will do a virtual presentation which will include "Meet The Author", read students passages from new books, and present her Canadian Black History Month activity book. Senior Classes will get to learn from her "Trailblazers" presentation.





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5.2 Teacher's Report

School-wide events:

• School-wide project for Black History month: Creating a schoolwide historical timeline, covering a span of 400 years, with 15 stops along the way, one for each homeroom project. Each homeroom has been designated a "Project Story" which can creatively be interpreted with students. At the end of February, all classes will have the opportunity to learn off one another by paying a covid friendly visit to the classrooms to see what project/door/play or art piece each class did. Extra Curricular Activities

• Chess Club resumed, and 4 students are now advancing to the semi-finals this week. Other Literacy program with the dog therapy ended this month. Students went home with books that they wrote and illustrated. Ms. Sabrina's grade 6 class (314) continues with the Dolls of Hope project for Refugees, and will expand the project further by asking for school-wide support. They are speaking at the February Governing Board meeting, and hope to spread awareness and gain support for this initiative. Their goal is to make and send out at least 100 toy bears to the Dolls of Hope organization by May 2, 2022. <u>Please see attachment for the "Dolls of hope handout"</u>

5.3 Day care Report


• February 14th Ped Day Activity: dressing in red, pink or purple, decorating heart shaped cookies. Students will be picking a secret valentine, and making a bracelet or key chain for them, and giving it to them at the end of the day.

• February 18th Ped Day Activity: Making Tie Dye T-shirts. Students will be asked to bring in a plain white T-Shirt, and they will be creating different patterns of tie dye with the help of their educator.

• Grades 5&6's are participating in a contest called BOKS CANADA. The program allows students to get physically active. It also allows them to work in teams, improves their memory and concentration, as well as social and emotional development such as learning to share and negotiate. We are currently 7 Base daycares participating after school. Those who are participating, send photos to EMSB BASE DAYCARE, of the challenging games they engage in. At the end of the contest, a school will be chosen as the winner, and receives a package of gross motor materials for the gymnasium and outdoors.

5.4 Parent Committee Report

Ms. Shalani presented the following matters in her PC report.

• Presentation and invitation to provide feedback on renewed status of 240 schools. These schools have a special status or project allowing them to be selective in the public-school context. There are two 240 EMSB high schools in the West End - Royal Vale and Royal West - and there is debate about whether the school admission procedures/demographics/culture are sufficiently diverse and equitable. Our commissioner, Julien Feldman, is committed to addressing the inequities in these schools, and he raises these issues at the Council and on the Equity committee.

• Continued discussion about internal rules and complaint procedures especially for sensitive issues such as racial discrimination (from the January meeting) and sexual harassment/assault (from the February meeting). Parents requested a workshop to get more information on how to identify grooming behaviour. We formed a committee to discuss other methods of prevention.

• Concerns about the return to in person learning. Parents are particularly worried about the new case reporting by grade instead of by class, and self-reporting by parents so there is the possibility some won't; the delay of report cards to mid February when they were already reduced from 3 to 2 in this year - this is particularly difficult for parents of students with special needs who feel that there is not enough time to react with tutors or other supports if learning in February that their child is struggling; no K/N95 masks for teachers or high-risk students; no access to PCR tests. The PC resolved to write a letter to the minister summarizing these concerns.

Introduced the budget building process to be discussed at the March meeting.

5.5 PPO Report

PPO chairs was approached and welcomed to provide \$100 to go toward teachers' appreciation week to express parents' appreciation for teachers all that they do.

Mr. Julien expressed his views on the matter of diversity and its importance in the schools to be well discussed in GB and school board meetings.
