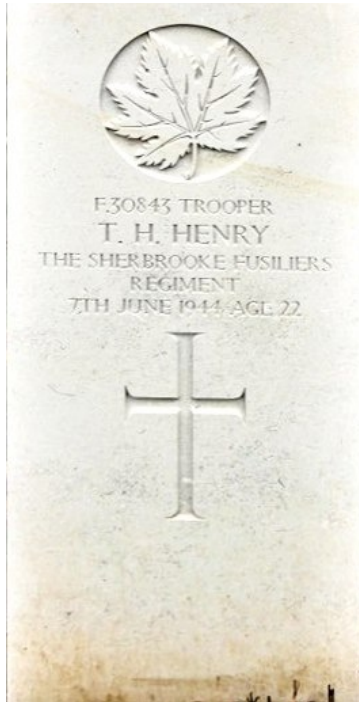


THOMAS H. HENRY



12 March 1922- 07 June 1944



Facts: Thomas Haliburton Henry graduated from Westmount High School in 1940, at the age of 18. The activities that he participated in were mostly drama acts/plays, like "Rip Van Winkle."

Military Position: Thomas H. Henry fought in the Sherbrooke Fusiliers Regiment, R..C.A.C. as a trooper. His division was the 27th Armed Regiment.

Battle Details: Thomas H. Henry fought in the Battle of Normandy, also known as D-Day, which began on June 6, 1944. He fell in battle overseas on June 7th, the day after D-Day started.

Burial: Thomas H. Henry is currently buried at the grave reference point VI. C. 3., at the Beny-Sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, in Calvados, France, where he fell in battle, on June 07, 1944. There are 2048 burials of other fallen comrades in the Battle of Normandy.

Family: Thomas H. Henry is the son of Thomas Haliburton Henry and May Aleta Millett Henry. His parents were from Georgetown, British Guiana.
