

Andrew Boyd Ketterson

(1922-1944)

On March 4, 1944 Andrew Boyd Ketterson was shot down in Belgium.

While escorting American bombers on Ramrod 623, PM, Fl/Lt. Ketterson is thought to have been hit by anti aircraft fire and he encountered difficulty with his engine. Sadly, he was killed in the ensuing crash, 15 miles east of Ypres.

Andrew Boyd Ketterson was a flight lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Air Force.

Flight Lieutenant (Flt Lt in the RAF and IAF; FLTLT in the RAAF and RNZAF—formerly sometimes F/L in all services) is a junior commissioned Air Force rank that originated in the Royal Naval Air Service and is still used in the Royal Air Force and many other countries, especially in the Commonwealth.
