Life of Hubert

Hubert Oberlin Lough was born on February 20, 1902. In his youth, he loved to play sports, such as baseball, basketball and hockey. He graduated from Westmount High School in 1919, and in 1927, he went on to graduate from McGill University with a medical degree.

In Hubert's free time, he liked to mess around with projectors.

Relationship with the military

Hubert Lough completed 10 years of study in general medicine in Tiverton and Kincardine before enlisting in the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps in February 1942. Once he completed his training, he went to the Canadian signal-training center, where he was chief of staff. He led the Medical inspection room at Vimy camp, up until the day he died.

Captain Lough's death

Chief of staff Oberlin Lough passed away on March 21, 1943. He suffered from coronary thrombosis otherwise known as a heart attack and fought for his life for 11 days before he was pronounced dead in Kingston Military Hospital.

He is buried at the Mont-Royal Cemetery in Outremont, Montreal Region.
