Benjamin Charles Philip Lyman was born on August 25, 1907, at Westmount, Quebec. His Father was Charles Philip Lyman, and his mother was Anne Mills. Both of his parents are born in Montreal. He went to Westmount High in his teens in 1920. He became a McGill graduate and received his civil engineering degree from the university in 1933. When Benjamin was 30, he married a wife named Edith D. Lyman. He enlisted into war in the October of 1939 for the Air Force.

4155 Cote des Neiges road, and husband of the former Edith Du-Perre, 5771 Trans-Island avenue, died suddenly at Rockcliffe Air Force Hospital on Friday. He had just recovered from a minor operation when he was seized by a heart attack and died almost instantly.

A native of this city, Flt.-Lt. Lyman was a graduate of Westmount High School and received his civil engineering degree from McGill in 1933.

He later died at the age of 36 in March 9, 1944, due to a heart attack while he was at a hospital. He is now buried at the Mount Royal cemetery.
