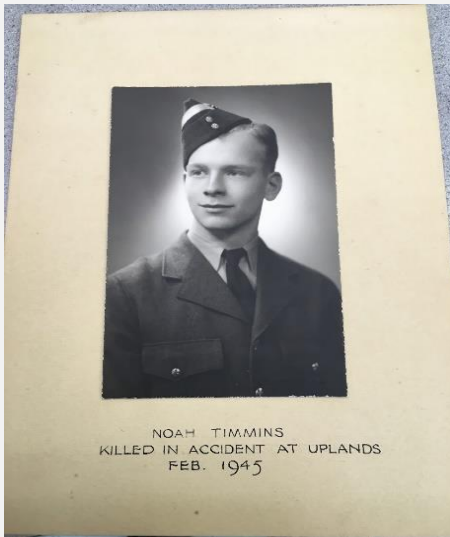

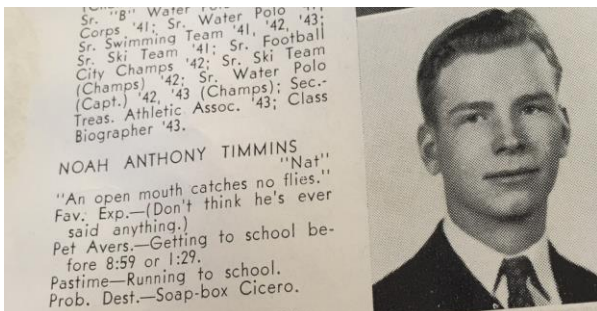

## LAC. Timmins Dies in Crash

Carp, Ont., Feb. 18 (CP).—LAC. Noah Anthony Timmins, 20-year-old son of Noah A. Timmins Jr. Montreal mining financier, was killed Saturday when his Harvard training plane crashed at Carp Airport. Carp is 20 miles west of Ottawa.

Observers said the young airman was circling the field at an altitude of about 700 feet when his plane suddenly nosed over, out of control, and crashed. He was alone in the two-seater aircraft, having taken off for a routine solo flight from his base at Uplands Air Station, near Ottawa.

\*Cause of the crash was unknown, and an official inquiry will be held. The body was taken to Ottawa and later forwarded to Montreal.

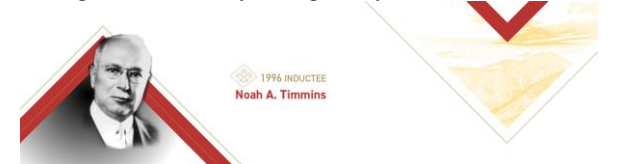
LAC. Timmins was a grandson of the late Noah Timmins, legendary figure in Canadian mining who staked the land that was to become the Hollinger mine at Timmins.

Recognized as the leader of a group of five men who invested their energies and resources in founding first the LaRose silver mine in Cobalt and later the Hollinger gold mine in Timmins, Noah Timmins is unquestionably a founding father of this country's mining industry.
