ARMY GIVES NAMES OF MURDERED MEN

Aurich, Dec. 12—(CP)—The names and regimental numbers of 37 of the 48 Canadian soldiers allegedly murdered by the Germans while prisoners of war at the time of the invasion of Normandy in June, 1944, have now been disclosed. Six were members of the Queen's Own Rifles. The bodies of the remaining 11 Canadians were found but they could not be identified.
