

The University has partnered with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas City to offer a Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) to all students. All KCU students are enrolled in the plan during an open enrollment period at the beginning of the academic year.

### **BRIDGING MEDICINE & COMMUNITY**

KCU student doctors take an active role in changing health care for good starting on day one. With collaborative classroom experiences structured to expand and deepen your medical knowledge and hands-on learning, clinical service and outreach activities refining your skills, a KCU medical education is student-centered, patient-focused and mission-driven.

As a KCU student doctor, you'll apply theoretical knowledge to practical situations starting in your first year.

- · Simulated clinical experiences, including training scenarios with high-fidelity medical manikins and simulated patient encounters that pair you with patient-actors, provide you with extensive opportunities to practice delivery of care without risk to real patients.
- · 'Score 1 for Health', a KCU clinical outreach program, provides free, in-school health assessments to more than 13,0000 area school children each year. For many kids, the health screenings they receive from a KCU student doctor are the only annual check-up they'll experience all year.


KCU's focus on public and population health prepares you to better understand the issues facing today's patients by strengthening your sense of responsibility and compassion with knowledge of the health disparities diverse communities and marginalized communities continue to face from renowned leaders in the field – fostering excellence, equity and empathy within the next generation of physicians.

### WHOLE PERSON CARE

KCU's heritage of osteopathic medicine is more than a proud history – it's also key to learning how to change health care for good. Osteopathic medicine believes in holistic care, prioritizing a "whole person" approach to medicine over the treatment of individual symptoms. While all osteopathic (DO) and allopathic (MD) programs are built on a traditional medical curriculum, osteopathic student doctors receive additional training on the relationship between the neuromusculoskeletal system and the rest of the body to identify barriers to healing and provide more effective treatment.

Approaching health care from an osteopathic perspective is more important than ever before. As negative social determinants of health, substance-use disorders and complex presentations continue to increase, physicians will need to understand how to identify and address systemic dysfunction – both of the human body and of society.

### **Global Health Track**

Learn the challenges and possibilities of international health care through medical missions and international clerkships to areas of need including Guatemala, Kenya and the Dominican Republic.



### **Military Medicine Track**

The Military Medicine Track is designed to equip Health Professions Scholarship Program recipients and National Guard members with the skills to serve as commissioned military physicians after graduation.

### **FELLOWSHIPS**

Student doctors who have achieved outstanding performance may apply for a fellowship to pursue advanced study in one of two specialties. Fellowships are completed in addition to the standard curriculum.



### **Clinical Anatomy**

The fellowship in Clinical Anatomy is an 11-month program that takes place during your third or fourth year. Anatomy fellows assist in teaching courses, manage anatomy lab lab management and complete a research project for publication.



### Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine

The fellowship in Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMM) gives you the ability to practice your skills while working with experienced osteopathic physicians. The OMM fellowship is a twelve-month training program that takes place between your third- and fourth-year clinical clerkship assignments, with a fifth year added to your KCU education to accommodate both your clerkship and fellowship obligations.


Like with osteopathic medicine, KCU takes a holistic approach to the admissions process to gain a better understanding of your potential for success as a student doctor.

However, there are certain admission criteria that all applicants must have:

- Completed undergraduate degree from an accredited university
- AACOMAS Application
- MCAT Score
- 2 Letters of Recommendation:
- One from a physician (DO or MD)
- One from a pre-med advisor or committee; may substitute a science faculty member
- The following coursework with a grade of C or higher:
- 12 semester hours of Biology
- 13 semester hours of Chemistry
- 8 semester hours of Physics
- 3 semester hours of Biochemistry (in addition to Chemistry)

The following optional qualifications will increase the competitiveness of your application:

- 100+ hours shadowing a physician
- Volunteer experience in a health care setting
- Work experience in a health care field (EMT, nurse, etc.)
- Two or more leadership roles in clubs/community organizations/work
- Involvement with community service organizations
- Research experience
- Participation in a domestic or international health mission trip
- Commitment of more than two years to an organization/club/job

### COMMUNITY-CENTERED EARLY CLINICAL EXPERIENCES

As a dental student doctors, you'll learn how to address the oral health needs of the Joplin regional community and beyond through both classroom and clinical experiences. Beginning in your first year, you'll provide comprehensive oral health care using a team-based model in the KCU Oral Health Center, our community-focused oral health facility. During your fourth year, you'll have experiential opportunities to provide patient care in off-campus, community-based dental facilities throughout the region, including federally qualified health centers, community health centers, Tribal facilities and other outpatient-based programs.



Our new state-of-the-science College of Dental Medicine introduces students to the most advanced dental technologies, reshaping your dental education and preparing you to be a leader in dentistry. Inside the dental simulation lab, you'll train with new technology such as intraoral digital scanners that eliminate the discomfort associated with traditional impressions and enable precise design of dental solutions in collaboration with patients, virtual reality dental trainers that hone your practical skills, advanced radiography machinery that captures detailed images for accurate diagnoses and 3D printers and digital milling devices that transform patients' smiles in ways never before possible. And, with two floors of dental operatories custom-built for KCU in the Oral Health Center, you'll partner with patients in a clinical environment like no other. empower patients to actively participate in treatment planning, fostering informed decisions.

### A LEARNING ENVIRONMENT MADE FOR PIONEERS

The College of Dental Medicine is located on the KCU Farber-McIntire Campus in Joplin, Missouri, and is home to two newly constructed facilities: the Dental Education Center and the Oral Health Center. The KCU College of Dental Medicine was created to address oral health disparities, but it was built to ensure student access to the best learning environments imaginable.

The Dental Education Center houses plentiful classroom and study space as well as a new Campus Commons, which includes a coffee shop, mini-market and grab-and-go dining options.

The Oral Health Center includes an active community clinic with custom dental operatories and imaging rooms, as well as dental simulation labs, 3D printing and digital milling technology, wet labs, clinical collaboration rooms and offices for faculty and clinic administration.


### **SERVING THE FOUR-STATE REGION**

Nearly all counties within a 125-mile radius of Joplin, Missouri, qualify as Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas (DHPSA) by the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration. With fewer dentists per capita than most areas in the United States, this four-state region has an immediate and critical need for more dentists.

As a dental student doctor, you'll be integral in correcting this urgent issue and other oral health disparities during your time at KCU and throughout your career as a dentist.

However, there are certain admission requirements all applicants must have

- Completed undergraduate degree from an accredited university
- AADSAS Application
- U.S. DAT score (must be dated no more than 3 years prior to application date)
- 3 Letters of Recommendation:
- One from a dentist
- One from a pre-med advisor or committee; may substitute a science faculty member
- One from an individual who can attest to your academic strengths, abilities and fit for dental school
- The following coursework with a grade of C or higher:
  - 8 semester hours of Biology
- 4 semester hours of Microbiology or Biochemistry
- 8 semester hours of Chemistry
- 8 semester hours of Organic Chemistry
- 12 additional semester hours of Biology, Chemistry and/or Physics
- Human Anatomy strongly recommended
- 6 semester hours of English Composition or Technical Writing
- Demonstrated community service through volunteerism and/or service-oriented employment
- Clinical dental experience (shadowing or practice)

### **HEALTH SERVICE PSYCHOLOGY**

Access to high-quality, compassionate mental and emotional health care has never been more important. KCU's clinical psychology program prepares students to be practicing psychologists through a curriculum focused on a comprehensive approach to studying human development across the lifespan. The five-year PsyD program includes coursework focused on working with a diverse range of age groups, the importance of understanding the unique needs and challenges faced by marginalized groups – including people of color and LGBTQ+ individuals - and experiential learning opportunities that help you gain knowledge and skills to provide culturally sensitive care to individuals from all backgrounds. Beginning in your third year, you'll begin to synthesize your classroom knowledge with your growing clinical skills by engaging in practicum experiences, dissertation work and a pre-doctoral internship.

### **MEDICAL SCHOOL SYNERGIES**

As a PsyD student, you are part of a skilled team within the College of Biosciences, but you also benefit from the KCU Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine and Dental Medicine. The doctoral curriculum in each college are built to work together, creating opportunities for interprofessional education and training that will prepare you to effectively collaborate on integrated health care teams and improve outcomes for your future patients.

### EARN YOUR MASTERS WHILE EARNING YOUR PSYD

Included as part of the program curriculum, PsyD students will earn a Master of Arts in Clinical Psychology degree after their second year of study – a major milestone that highlights your commitment to clinical psychology and helps you stand out as a candidate for pre- and post-doctoral internships as well as future job applications.

The non-terminal degree will be added as a notation on your transcript and is formally awarded when all the following criteria have been met:

- Successful completion of all coursework in the first two years;
- Successful completion of the qualifying examination; and
- Student is in good academic standing





### **DIVERSE PRACTICUM SITES**

The practicum experience provides you with the opportunity to develop and demonstrate the necessary clinical competencies needed for your future internship. Practicums are part-time, off-campus commitments that typically average 20 hours per week, and last between 9-12 months.



MASTER OF SCIENCE IN BIOMEDICAL SCIENCES KCU COLLEGE OF BIOSCIENCES

### 1-YEAR ACCELERATED TRACK

has a track made to help you reach your goals.

Whether you're looking to prepare for future advanced training in medical or health science education or ready to join to one of many rapidly growing health science fields, KCU's biomedical sciences professional program

Designed for students interested in pursuing an advanced degree in health care fields such as medicine, dentistry, pharmacy or other allied health-training programs, the 1-year track includes intensive coursework in areas such as anatomy, biochemistry, cell biology, epidemiology, genetics, immunology, molecular biology, physiology and research design & methodology. This one-year master's program will sharpen your skills and deepen your knowledge base, helping best prepare you for future advanced training.

### 2-YEAR RESEACH TRACK

Designed for students primarily interested in a career in research, bioinformatics, biotech, and other science fields; enrolling in PhD programs in the biomedical sciences; or wanting more intensive preparation for future pursuit of admission in a doctoral program, the two-year research track includes additional emphasis on advanced courses and dedicated opportunities to work side-by-side with faculty researchers and/or researchers at partner institutions.

### **UNLOCKING BIOINFORMATICS**

Advancements in technology are drastically changing research, health care and our understanding of what is possible. Bioinformatics bridges the divide between biology and technology, revealing immense potential for scientific advancement. Students enrolled in the two-year research track, particularly those who are interested in a career in biotech, can choose a research emphasis in bioinformatics.

As a bioinformatics student you'll focus on using computer technology to solve real-world biomedical research questions, training with a variety of bioinformatic tools and concepts used for big data analysis such as database design, software design and bioanalytical computer coding (like Python). And, you'll conduct bioinformatics research with KCU faculty and/or with researchers at partner institutions including Children's Mercy Hospital, MRI Global and Likarda.

The AOA is the official accrediting agency for osteopathic medicine approved by the United States Department of Education and by the Council of Higher Education Accreditation.

#### **COLLEGE OF DENTAL MEDICINE**

The Kansas City University College of Dental Medicine program in predoctoral dental education is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation and has been granted the accreditation status of "initial accreditation." The Commission is a specialized accrediting body recognized by the United Stated Department of Education.
