 - Evaluate how much your work contributes to the field. Is it a significant step forward?
- Relevance:
 - Assess the relevance of your findings to the broader context.
- Strength of Mechanistic Insights (Major Criterion):
 - Examine the depth of understanding your research provides. Does it uncover underlying mechanisms or processes?
- Completeness:
 - Ensure your study covers all relevant aspects.
- Potential Implications for Other Fields:
 - Consider how your research might impact related disciplines.

3. PRESENTER/PRESENTATION (0 - 10 points)

- Critical Thinking on Results and Related Work (Major Criterion):
 - Demonstrate your ability to analyze and interpret results critically. Contextualize your findings.
- Knowledge Level:
 - Showcase your expertise in the subject matter.
- Quality, Clarity, and Depth of Presentation:
 - Deliver a clear, engaging, and well-organized presentation. Be prepared to answer questions from the audience.
