





## National Distribution of Kansas City University College of Osteopathic Medicine ANESTHESIOLOGY Graduates






## National Distribution of Kansas City University College of Osteopathic Medicine FAMILY MEDICINE Graduates




### National Distribution of Kansas City University College of Osteopathic Medicine GENERAL SURGERY Graduates




















# Economic Impact of Missouri's Primary Care Physicians \* (2024) Including KCU-COM Primary Care Graduates










