University Tradition

The Commencement Ceremony is an important tradition at Kansas City University. Both a formal recognition of the academic accomplishments made by the graduates as well as a celebration of their potential to continue *improving the well-being of the communities we serve* for future generations, each Commencement Ceremony is a historic moment for our graduates, their loved ones and the University.

As such, the Commencement Ceremony includes a number of symbolic traditions that honor the importance of this day. The following section provides a brief overview of the unspoken traditions you will witness during today's ceremony.

MACES

An ancient symbol of authority that was originally held by individuals protecting dignitaries, the mace reminds us that universities are custodians both of the enduring tradition of learning and of the power they bestow upon those who have come to learn.

University Mace

The University Mace holds the highest formal purpose of all the maces, representing the University's governing authority and signifying that the event has official sanction. It is carried by the Faculty Marshal during the ceremony.

Graduation Scepters

Gifted to the University by Lee E. Davidson, DO (COM '45), in 1975, this pair of replicas of the Rod of Asclepius were hand-crafted from wood and bronze by then-student doctor Evany Zirul, DO (COM '79). The graduation scepters are now carried by Student Marshals during the ceremony.

The Centennial Mace

The Centennial Mace was commissioned in 2016 to commemorate the University's Centennial Celebration and was first carried by G. Michael Johnston, DO, MACOI (COM '73), KCU alumnus, long-time professor and associate provost for faculty and student success. A modern interpretation of the Rod of Asclepius that has been crafted from metal alloy, the Centennial Mace reflects the intersection of the University's first 100 years of history and our beginning of a new century of innovation. The Centennial Mace is traditionally reserved for display on the Kansas City campus; however, at the discretion of the President, it may instead be carried by the Faculty Marshal in lieu of the University Mace during select Commencement Ceremonies.

GONFALONS

Gonfalons are heraldic banners adding an element of pageantry to the ceremony. Tracing back to medieval Italy, "gonfaloni" were originally the community meetings during which every neighborhood displayed its own custom, ornate flag. Over time, the word has become associated with the flag itself, and gonfalons have become part of ceremonies worldwide.

Kansas City University's gonfalons serve to herald the presence of both the University as a whole and the colleges participating in each ceremony. Student gonfaloniers, or carriers of the flags, each carry their college's respective gonfalon during the Commencement Ceremony.

University Tradition

REGALIA

Academic regalia traces its beginnings to the Middle Ages. When English universities were forming in the 12th and 13th centuries, scholars were also clerics and they adopted robes similar to those of their monastic orders. Caps were a necessity in drafty buildings and capes with hoods attached were needed for warmth. In 1895, the Intercollegiate Commission specified a code that was adopted by American institutions of higher learning to standardize the regalia worn by faculty and graduates. It has stood virtually unchanged to present time.

Master's Regalia

Master's gowns are silk-finish, black gowns with oblong sleeves that open at the wrist and feature a crescent-shaped trailing edge. The master's cap is a rigid mortarboard with a medium-length tassel that matches the color of the velvet trim of the master's hood. Master's tassels are worn on the left side of the cap at all times.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the master's regalia. Master's hoods are medium length and feature a crescent-shaped trailing edge which compliments the sleeves of the master's gown. The color of the velvet edging of the hood indicates the degree earned while the color of the satin lining represents the university from which that degree has been conferred. Several combinations can be seen on the regalia worn by KCU administration and faculty, but the colors on the following page will be worn by KCU graduates.

Doctor's Regalia

Doctor's gowns are silk-finish gowns trimmed down the front with velvet and have three velvet bars on the bell-shaped sleeves. The velvet color is unique to the discipline for which the degree pertains, or may be black. The doctor of osteopathic medicine, as well as the doctor of medicine, is represented by green velvet.

The doctoral cap is an eight-sided velvet tam with short tassels that match the color of the velvet trim of the doctoral hood, although metallic gold tassels are also permitted. As with master's tassels, doctor's tassels are worn on the left side of the cap at all times.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of the doctor's regalia. Doctor's hoods are long and marked by a wide velvet binding in the color representing the degree earned. The color of the hood's interior satin lining represents the university from which that degree has been conferred. Myriad combinations can be seen on the regalia worn by KCU administration, faculty and guest hooders, but the colors on the following page will be worn by KCU graduates.

LATIN HONORS

Graduating with Latin Honors is a distinction that marks tremendous academic achievement. Graduates awarded Latin Honors wear bronze medallions on green grosgrain ribbon.

Summa Cum Laude
Bestowed with highest distinction
upon students graduating in the
top 2 percent of their class.

Magna Cum Laude
Bestowed with great distinction upon
students graduating in the top
3 to 7 percent of their class.

Cum Laude
Bestowed with distinction upon
students graduating in the top
8 to 12 percent of their class.

Honors Cords

Two honor societies provide graduates with a visual representation of their membership through braided honors cords worn over the standard regalia. Gold Humanism Honor Society members wear purple cords. Sigma Sigma Phi members wear burnt orange cords.

Additionally, graduates participating the Military Commissioning Ceremony, as well as graduates and faculty members who are veterans of the United States Armed Forces, may elect to wear braided red, white and blue Military Honors cords in recognition of their service to their country.

MEDALLIONS

Symbolic medallions are worn by Kansas City University academic administration, including the president and deans, to mark the occasion of Commencement. Additionally, graduates with certain academic distinctions are awarded medallions to reflect their accomplishments.

These distinctions include: members of Psi Sigma Alpha wear medallions on yellow grosgrain ribbon; graduates who completed a fellowship in anatomy or osteopathic manipulative medicine wear a silver medallion on white grosgrain ribbon; graduates bestowed with Latin Honors wear medallions on green grosgrain ribbon. These medallions are worn over the standard regalia.

keeping in mind always nature's laws and the body's inherent capacity for recovery.

I will be ever vigilant in aiding in the general welfare of the community, sustaining its laws and institutions,

not engaging in those practices which will in any way bring shame or discredit upon myself or my profession. I will give no drugs for deadly purposes to any person, though it be asked of me.

I will endeavor to work in accord with my colleagues in a spirit of progressive cooperation,

and never by word or by act cast imputations upon them or their rightful practices.

I will look with respect and esteem upon all those who have taught me my art.

To my college I will be loyal and strive always for its best interests and for the interests of the students who will come after me.

I will be ever alert to further the application of basic biologic truths to the healing arts

and to develop the principles of osteopathy which were first enunciated by Andrew Taylor Still.
