Abstract Guidelines

- Abstracts are limited to 300 words.
- Original Work: All abstracts must be original and unpublished. Abstracts presenting findings or novel analyses not included in full publications are welcome.
- **Encore Abstracts**: Abstracts presenting the same research at multiple conferences are allowed.

- Content Restrictions: No literature reviews unless new research, theory, or hypotheses are included. Commercial abstracts and those with proprietary restrictions are not allowed.
- **Scientific Focus**: All abstracts must be scientific in nature and free of commercial, political, or inappropriate references.
- **Single Presenter**: Each abstract must have only one presenting author. No multiple presenters allowed.
- **Location Restrictions**: Presentations (both podium and poster) must be assigned to a single location (Kansas City or Joplin) no double-location presentations.

Abstract Structure

- **Title**: Use lowercase letters with only the first word capitalized (e.g., *Temperature dependence of ionizing radiation effects on dry preparations of bacterial enzymes*).
- Author Information: List all authors and their institutions.
- **Body of Abstract**: Must be single-spaced. No tables, graphs, or structural formulae allowed, though simple mathematical formulas are acceptable.

Poster Formatting

- Orientation: All posters must be in portrait orientation.
- **Dimensions**: Posters must be 36" W x 48" H.
- **Template**: KCU participants, please use the following poster template: KCU Poster Template

The KCU Research Symposium Committee will recognize top presenters during the event. Students are eligible for awards for both oral and poster presentations.
