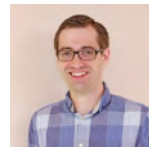

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Emergency departments are the front line of medicine. They treat a wide range of patients – from traumatic injuries to treating those who do not have a primary care provider. Working together, the ER team makes split second decisions to save the lives of patients. From the Emergency Medicine Physicians, to the nurses, imaging and lab techs, the ER team is the first to treat the sickest patients and has the most opportunity to make the biggest difference. Each member of our ER team plays an important role in the patient’s survival.

We recognize the impact of seeing an experienced ER team, led by an Emergency Medicine physician, can mean to the health of our community. That’s why Coffeyville Regional Medical Center is committed to providing the region with the only Emergency Room staffed 24/7 with Emergency Medicine Physicians. Our physicians are Board Certified or Board Eligible in Emergency Medicine – and that means experienced care for you.

What is an Emergency Medicine Physician?

Emergency Medicine Physicians are specialized and certified in the discipline of Emergency Medicine. A physician who specializes in Emergency Medicine focuses on the immediate decision-making and actions necessary to prevent death or any further disability both in the pre-hospital setting by directing emergency medical technicians and in the emergency department. This specialist provides immediate recognition, evaluation, care, stabilization and disposition of a generally diversified population of adult and pediatric patients in response to acute illness and injury.

The training for Emergency Medicine Physicians is intensive. After graduating from medical school, they receive three, and sometimes four years of specialized training designed to recognize symptoms or injuries that could be serious or life threatening.

Why Emergency Medicine Physicians Are So Important

Life and death situations are a regular occurrence in an emergency room. Emergency Medicine Physicians are trained in the medical specialty of the diagnosis and treatment of unforeseen injury or illness. Emergency Medicine encompasses a unique body of knowledge that includes the initial evaluation, diagnosis, treatment, coordination of care among multiple providers – and the capability to make decisions on the disposition of a patient needing immediate medical, surgical, or psychiatric care. CRMC is proud to partner with the Green Country Emergency Physician Group for patient care in our ER. These physicians are board certified/eligible in emergency medicine. Emergency Medicine Physicians are specifically trained to treat patients in an emergent situation. At CRMC, ER physicians have quick access to imaging, radiology, lab services and even surgery if necessary to best care for their patients. CRMC has several specialists that can also consult on patient care.

You Have A Choice

You may request any ambulance service to take you to CRMC. You also have the right to request to be brought to CRMC if you are offered any type of shuttle service from any provider.

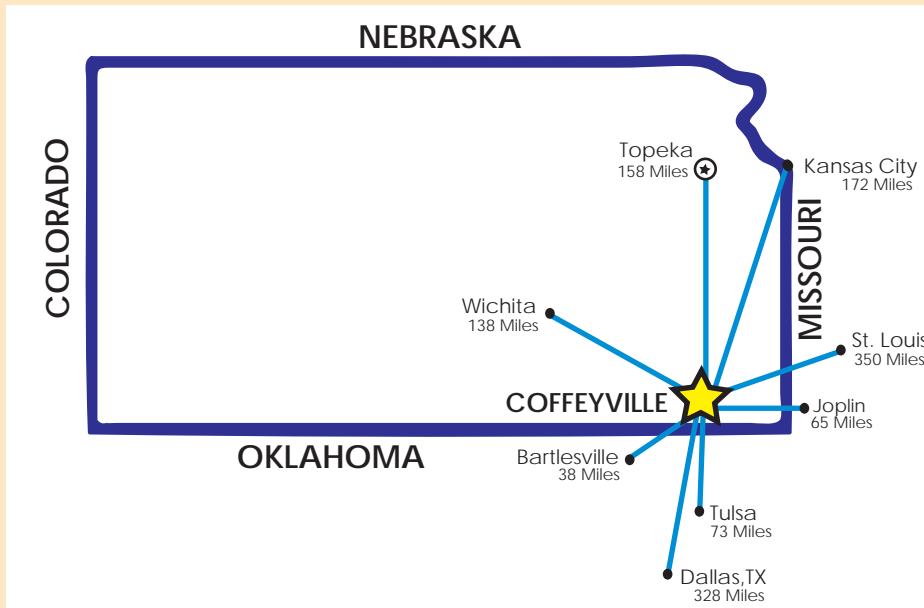

Payment and Financial Assistance:

Insurance:

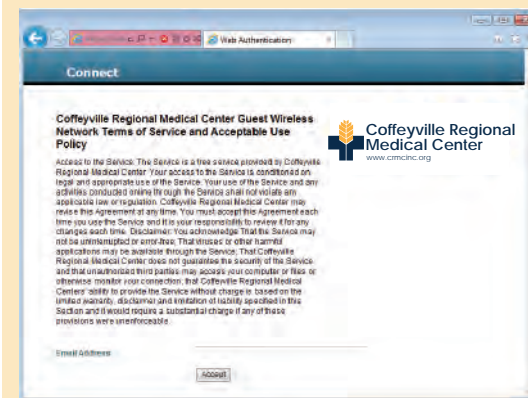

HOW TO ACCESS TO COFFEYVILLE REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER'S FREE PUBLIC WIFI:

1. Locate the Public-CRMC wireless icon on the available wireless networks.
2. Connect to the Public-CRMC network.
3. When opening an internet browser, such as Internet Explorer, it will come up with the splash screen. (Like one Above)
4. Enter a valid email address in the box provided and then click accept.
5. An acknowledgment of successful connection will come up.
6. Access to the Public- will be valid for 1 day. Each day of needed access you will have to complete the above process.

EMS SERVICES

In an emergency, many times it is the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) responders who transport the patient to the hospital and provide preliminary treatment before arrival. During transport, they are in close communication with the Emergency Department personnel, receiving instructions and providing patient disposition on the way.

CRMC EMS covers the southeastern corner of Montgomery County, the southwestern corner of Labette County and the Northeast corner of Nowata County in Oklahoma. In addition to transporting patients, they work with the police and fire departments to provide additional support when needed and, when requested, the police and fire departments provide reciprocal support. EMS Director Jim Wilhelms said, "We are part of a big team of emergency professionals with specialized skills. Our goal is to save lives in an emergency situation, and to keep our community safe."

CRMC EMS is a hospital-based service that provides assistance within the hospital and serves on hospital committees and disaster preparedness committees within the region. It is unique because most EMS services are fire-based, city-based, or private.

Technology

CRMC has four ambulances equipped with state-of-the-art equipment. Each has 12-lead cardiac monitors and portable ventilators for adults, pediatric patients or infants. In addition they have specialized equipment for certain types of respiratory problems, which can help prevent the patient from being on a ventilator, and provide a better patient outcome.

Coffeyville Regional Medical Center wants you to feel confident in seeking emergency treatment in our Emergency Department. We have taken great measures to provide you with the most talented and specialty trained physicians and emergency support staff in the area, with a medical team that delivers life-saving care when you need it most.

SANE/SART - Providing Care to Adolescent and Adult Victims of Sexual Assault

No one wants to prepare for sexual assault but that is exactly what CRMC and its local partners are doing to help the community and victims of sexual assault.

CRMC is dedicated to providing immediate compassionate, and culturally sensitive care to all victims of sexual assault.



In addition the sexual assault nurse examiners will provide comprehensive forensic evaluation and treatment according to state and international policies. CRMC staff work closely with law enforcement officers to best care for victims. CRMC will be able to meet the needs of sexual assault victims in providing treatment as well as collecting valuable evidence that may help prosecute their abuser.

SANE - The SANE is a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner who is a Registered Nurse with specialized training in the treatment and care of victims of sexual assault. SART - The SART is a Sexual Assault Response Team of compassionate professionals that provide an immediate, multi-disciplinary response to adolescent and adult victims of sexual assault.

Due to the current culture of disbelief, more than half of sexual assaults are not reported. Victims feel ashamed and responsible for the assault, and do not trust the system to keep them safe from retaliation.

Sexual assault victims suffer both physically and psychologically after an attack and time to process what has just happened to them is often needed. The SANE/SART is available to assist victims every step of the way.

SANE/SART provides qualified professionals to give victim centered care and support in a 'safe place'.

- Individual medical-legal examinations.

CANCER TREATMENT SERVICES

The single word "cancer" makes an impact that can leave a person trembling in their shoes; it can influence someone to re-evaluate their life and even lead to personal triumph.

For over 40 years Coffeyville Regional Medical Center has helped people face this disease, work through concerns, and face one of the biggest challenges of their life. At Coffeyville Regional Medical Center, area residents will find the advanced technology needed to fight cancer and the compassion to provide hope to patients and their families.

Living in a rural area can be a challenge as you consider where to go for treatment. It may involve travel while not feeling well and overnight stays in unfamiliar surroundings. We are fortunate in rural southeast Kansas to have a cancer treatment program that includes medical oncology as well as radiation oncology and surgical services, all under one roof at Coffeyville Regional Medical Center. However, not all cancer treatment programs are alike. At CRMC we are different, combining the best technology in state-of-the-art treatment with a human element of compassion and caring.

Tatman Cancer Center (Medical Oncology)

Patients at the Tatman Cancer Center receive the same advanced treatment available at larger facilities: Chemotherapy, IV Therapy, Hormonal Therapy and Blood Component Transfusion. The oncologist utilizes the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) or the National Comprehensive Cancer Center Network (NCCN) guidelines for selection of cancer treatment. The Tatman Cancer Center works closely with other state-of-the-art centers such as MD Anderson to provide the actual chemotherapy treatment plan so that patients can be treated close to home.

Surgical Services - A team of surgeons, anesthesia providers, and peri-operative nurses provide competent and compassionate care to the patients and their families. The Surgical Services Department works as a team with Pathology, Medical Imaging, both Radiation and Medical Oncology, and Nursing Services to expedite the diagnostic and treatment process for the cancer patient.

Jerry Marquette Radiation Oncology Center

The Jerry Marquette Radiation Oncology Center offers state-of-the-art patient care with a new facility that opened late in 2011. Located adjacent to the Medical Imaging and Surgery areas off of Fourth Street, it allows both outpatients and inpatients the convenience of having diagnostic work and treatment done in the same area. A state-of-the-art linear accelerator, along with other advanced equipment is also part of the facility, providing patients the most up-to-date treatment available.

A Team Approach to Cancer Treatment

A committee consisting of a multidisciplinary group of physicians and non-physician representatives—from administration, cancer registry, quality improvement, medical oncology, nursing, radiation oncology, pharmacy, education, and nutrition meets quarterly. It is responsible to oversee the cancer program, to ensure full compliance with all the standards set by the American College of Surgeons, and for planning, initiating and evaluating cancer care at Coffeyville Regional Medical Center.

The major focus of this Cancer Committee is quality patient care. In addition, it addresses support areas, including pain management and nutrition for patients with cancer.

The CRMC Medical Staff regularly conducts a multidisciplinary Cancer Conference, a focused group of physicians and medical professionals that meet twice a month. Representation includes a Medical Oncologist, Radiation Oncologist, Diagnostic Radiologist, Pathologist and a Surgeon. Other specialties that attend include OB/GYN, Internist, Family Practice, General Practice and Urologist. This group is sometimes called the Tumor Board, which discusses staging of cancer and the NCCN guidelines (National Comprehensive Cancer Network); it also reviews individual cases to provide analysis from different perspectives, offering a team approach to treating cancer.

"One comment we hear a lot is about the caring relationship we have with our patients. We had a patient come in with her sister from another town, and the patient's sister was surprised that everyone in our office knew her sister's name. Here, our patients are not just a number, and we pride ourselves in getting to know our patients on a more personal level. In addition, we often are able to help patients with other concerns, such as finding financial resources for treatment or an expensive drug, or help with transportation to and from treatments. We have access to resources beyond what the patient may have and, many times, we are able to help with a myriad of needs."

Cancer treatment is disruptive enough in our patients' lives. The MCA's core goal is to facilitate advanced clinical trials for cancer patients as close to their homes as possible, helping to remove one of the burdens of receiving cancer care. We are able to give patients access to some of the latest resources, such as clinical trials right here at home. Oncologists affiliated with the MCA can efficiently share information to help diagnose and treat patients, which adds to our knowledge of cancer and advances our highest standards of care.

Treatment Plans from Anywhere Delivered Close to Home

Earlier we talked about our new partnership with Midwest Cancer Alliance who connects us with The University of Kansas Cancer Center. We welcome our patients to check all their options. Many common cancers have a standard treatment plan from one facility to the next. However, when a cancer is rare, patients are generally referred to a larger cancer center. As an example, a patient chooses to work with MD Anderson, which requires the need to travel. It can be difficult to travel and be in unfamiliar surroundings when undergoing treatment. However, once the patient has a treatment plan, or prescription, in most cases it can be filled at Coffeyville Regional Medical Center and the treatments can be performed at home, eliminating the need to travel. "This has become more common for our patients to return to us for continued treatment after being seen at another cancer center," said Vicky Portwood, director of The Tatman Cancer Center. "Not only is it more convenient, but the patient can undergo treatments and return to their homes afterwards."

RADIATION ONCOLOGY



In 1978, Coffeyville native and Radiation Oncologist, Dr. Terry Powell, became involved in the planning for a Radiation Oncology treatment center to be built at Coffeyville Regional Medical Center. Two years later, in 1980, a new Radiation Oncology department was established. Dr. Powell was the Medical Director for the new Radiation Oncology department for over 30 years at CRMC until he retired in 2011. CRMC Welcomed Dr. Nathan Uy, Radiation Oncologist, to the team in 2005. He took over for Dr. Powell's position when he retired. **CRMC has served the community for 39 years in Radiation Oncology.**

MEDICAL ONCOLOGY

The first CRMC Outpatient Oncology clinic opened in July of 1983 and offered a complete program for the diagnosis and treatment of patients with cancer. The Medical Oncology Clinic is housed in the Tatman Cancer Center, which is located in the Outpatient Services Department at Coffeyville Regional Medical Center. This program is under the direction of Akin Ogundipe, MD, Hematology & Medical Oncology, and Vicky Portwood, RN, MSN, OCN, Director of Cancer Services. **CRMC has served the community for 36 years in Medical Oncology.**



THE CANCER REGISTRY

The Cancer Registry is a data based registry that maintains information on all cancer cases and certain benign tumors diagnosed at, or treated at, Coffeyville Regional Medical Center. This information is used for studies involving the care and treatment of cancer patients at a local, state and national level.

NEUROSURGERY SERVICES

Neurosurgery is the medical specialty of prevention, diagnosis, surgical intervention, and rehabilitation of disorders specific to the brain, spine, spinal cord, and nerve roots. The spine encompasses and protects the spinal cord. Spinal surgery is usually indicated for stabilization or to eliminate arm, leg, or low back pain.

What procedures are performed by the Neurosurgeon?

Common procedures performed include: microdiscectomy, microlaminotomy, microlaminectomy, posterior lumbar fusions, anterior cervical disectomy and fusion (ACDF), kyphoplasty and anterior lumbar inner-body fusion (ALIF).

Microsurgery

Microsurgery is a type operating technique that involves a small surgical incision of 1-1.5 inches or less. The benefits of microsurgery include shorter hospital stays, faster recovery times, and immediate results. Gery Hsu, MD, specializes in microsurgery. Sixty-five percent of all surgeries performed by Dr. Hsu are done microsurgically.

Kyphoplasty

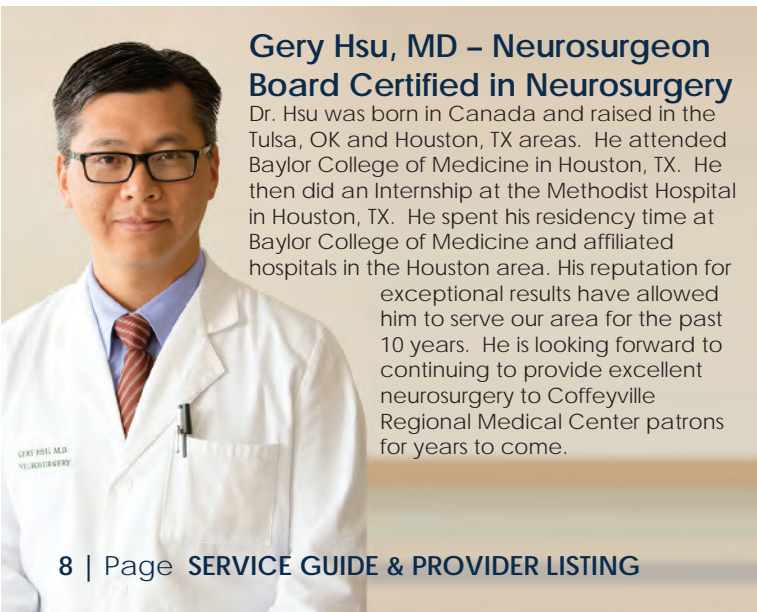
Kyphoplasty is a minimally invasive procedure that repairs spinal fractures with bone cement. The benefits of kyphoplasty include minimal recovery time and improvement in mobility. The procedure can be done on an outpatient basis, meaning you may go home that evening.

Lumbar Fusion

Whether approached anteriorly or posteriorly, a lumbar fusion is intended to stabilize a problematic area of the spine. Over time, this stability provides a reduction in pain for those suffering from mechanical issues of the low back.

ORTHOPEDIC SERVICES

When nonsurgical interventions are no longer helping to alleviate your pain - such as medication and physical therapy - then it may be time for hip, knee, or shoulder replacement. Other signs may be aching in the joint, followed by periods of relative relief; pain after extensive use; loss of mobility; joint stiffness after periods of inactivity or rest; and/or pain that seems to increase in humid weather.

At Coffeyville Regional Medical Center, we want to keep you moving and enjoying life. We offer a comprehensive range of orthopedic services, including:

- Knee, Hip and shoulder replacement
- Trauma surgery such as pelvic and acetabular fractures
- Revision hip and knee arthroplasties
- Foot, ankle and hand surgery (carpal tunnel, fractures etc.)
- Ganglion cyst and benign tumor surgery
- Physical therapy
- Rehabilitation

Joint Camp at CRMC

We understand that a decision to have joint replacement surgery is made with care. Our orthopedic team is there to assist you and your family on your journey towards a better life. We strive to provide excellent care, to exceed your expectations, and we want you to achieve a full recovery so you can get back to your life as quickly as possible. This will be accomplished as you and your orthopedic team members (nurses, physician, and therapists) work together.

Rehabilitation - An Integral Part of Your Joint Replacement

Physical Therapy provides a very important role in the final phase of a patient's recuperation from joint replacement. The physical therapist is licensed to provide therapy for the entire body. According to Darci Berry, DPT, Director of Rehabilitation Services, inpatients are seen for therapy seven days a week while they are here recovering - including Saturday and Sunday.

"This is not common at other hospitals; we will provide weekend therapy for our outpatients as well, if the physician orders it or a patient is not progressing," said Berry. "As far as post-op and discharge of outpatient surgeries, a patient is scheduled for PT/OT within 24 hours, as soon as an order is received from the physician. We make it a priority for them to be seen the next day."

"We also offer vaso-pneumatic compression (or ice compression therapy)," said Fisher. "The benefit to the patient is decreased post-op pain and/or edema (swelling), and research has shown faster healing time. We are the only facility in southeast Kansas that provides this treatment."

UROLOGY SERVICES

Urological issues can appear at any age and are sometimes an uncomfortable topic. But there is no need to suffer in silence. CRMC specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the urinary system in men and women, and disorders of the male reproductive system. We offer a private, supportive and personal environment to help regain your quality of life.

When a medical condition limits your daily activities or affects your quality of life, it's a relief to know that help is available. Dr. Bernard Howerter takes a personalized approach to care and will work closely with you to provide the best, most effective treatment.

What do Urologists do?

Urologists specialize in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the urinary system in both men and women. They treat issues that may appear in your kidneys, bladder, adrenal glands, ureters and urethra. The urinary tract and reproductive systems are intertwined in men, so urologists treat both. Should cancer be detected in or around the urinary tract (e.g. prostate, testicular, kidney or bladder cancer), a urologist is often consulted.

Geeta Sandhu Women's Health Unit

The Women's Health Unit allows patients to labor, deliver and recover in the same room. Patients also have whirlpool tubs available to use during labor to help relieve their pain. A dedicated surgical suite is available in the Geeta Sandhu Women's Health Unit for planned or emergency cesarean sections.

With a combined experience of over 195 years, the nursing staff strives to develop a personal relationship with each patient during their time together. The staff are experienced in calming patients and assisting them through the joys and trials of labor and delivery.

Expectant mothers are able to move down the hall for their surgery and then return to their room. "The Women's Health Unit staff puts their patients first," said Dr. Dara Gibson. "The staff care about their patient's pain and try to make them comfortable. The whirlpool tubs offer great heat therapy for relaxing muscles during labor and our anesthesia team is readily available for epidurals."

Security is of the utmost importance and all infants have security bracelets that match their parents. Infants also receive a security ankle bracelet shortly after birth that will sound an alarm if the baby were removed from the locked department. New mothers can expect support and training prior to and after the birth of their child.

CRMC offers free childbirth education classes to help parents prepare for the birth of their child. The class includes education on the stages of labor,

breastfeeding, postpartum, infant care and also includes a tour of the Women's Health Unit.

Expectant mothers may also receive a 3D/4D ultrasound in the recently renovated OB Ultrasound room. The room was designed with seating for family members to view the ultrasound live or allow family to see pictures of the baby on a 50" flat screen TV in an adjacent room.

CRMC recognizes that fathers are an important part of the delivery process! That's why each room has a sofa sleeper for their comfort.

Oh baby! A new kind of pregnancy and birthing experience!

Whether you are in the immediate planning stages for your family, or looking to the future – when it comes to having a baby – Nobody delivers like CRMC.

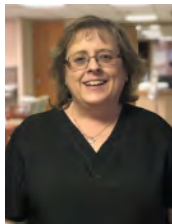

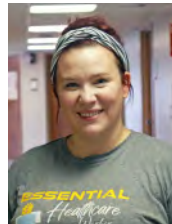

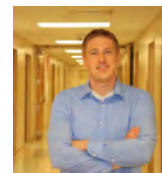

• **3D and 4D Ultrasound** - "Will I have a boy or girl?" CRMC offers a fetal sex ultrasound at around 18-22 weeks of pregnancy. The fetal sex ultrasound does not require a doctor's order, but there is a fee for this service. To schedule an Ultrasound call, 620-251-1523.

• **Maternal & Infant Services (M&I)** – This clinic provides comprehensive prenatal care and follow-up for mother and infant for up to one year post delivery. The M&I clinic is located at the CRMC Medical Group in Independence and is offered every Wednesday from 9:00am – 4:00pm. Financial assistance and a nutritionist are available to expectant mothers during their visits. Patients will see Judy Carpenter, APRN for the majority of their appointments, and then will be provided a CRMC Medical Group OB/GYN physician for the last four weeks of pregnancy. Post-op care is provided, as well.

• **Wee Care Baby Support** – CRMC helps new mothers in the adjustment period of parenting with all its new responsibilities. We understand many questions and fears may arise in the first weeks and months when a new little one joins the family. Mothers are encouraged to come with baby to the Geeta Sandhu Women's Health Services unit to receive support and encouragement.

ANESTHESIA TEAM

If you are anticipating a surgery or procedure, you expect to receive an anesthetic to prevent pain during the surgery. We are fortunate today that we have sophisticated surgical departments that can minimize pain and anxiety associated with surgery. CRMC offers multiple surgical specialties: General Surgery, OB-GYN, ENT, Urology, Neurosurgery, Orthopedics and Podiatry. These surgeries wouldn't be possible, however, without Anesthesiologists and Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA's).

Anesthesia's Role

Many activities take place before a surgery. The process begins with the patient who meets with the surgeon to decide if surgery is right for him or her. Large amounts of information such as medical history, prior surgeries, medications and test results, are collected and reviewed. A few days before the surgery, anesthesia reviews the patient's chart to ensure the patient is stable before surgery, and collaborates with other specialties if more information is needed. An example is a patient with cardiac disease that requires blood thinner medications. Anesthesia collaborates with both the surgeon and physician who ordered the medication to plan how long the patient will not take their medication prior to surgery. In other words, the anesthesia team is the "gate-keeper" of ensuring patient safety.

On the day of surgery, the anesthesia provider will meet with the patient to discuss anesthesia care options. Common concerns that can be alleviated are anxiety, postoperative nausea and pain management.

Surgery Department Director Teresa Barker spoke highly of the Anesthesia team at CRMC saying, "I am proud of the surgical experience our patients get each and every day at CRMC. Anesthesia providers are usually not credited for the advanced care that is provided before, during and after surgery. These providers, that our CRMC Surgical Team gets to work with each and every day, do an excellent job. Their skills improve patient care and make a difference in our patient's lives."

HOSPITALISTS

In January 2016, CRMC moved toward a growing trend in hospitals by hiring hospitalists to care for patients admitted to the hospital that do not have a regular physician providing inpatient care.

What is a Hospitalist?

A hospitalist is a physician that specifically cares for patients in the hospital. Most hospitalists are board-certified internists (internal medicine) who have gone through the same training as other internal medicine physicians, including medical school, residency training and board-certification examination. The difference is that hospitalists have chosen not to practice internal medicine in a clinic setting. Some hospitalists are family practice physicians or medical sub specialists who chose to do hospitalist work.

Studies have shown that, nationwide, hospital patients fair better when their doctor is a hospitalist. Researchers theorize that this improved recovery is based on several factors:

- First, hospital medicine is much different than clinic medicine and it is difficult to stay abreast of the most recent advances in hospital medicine when trying to do the same in a clinic.
- Secondly, hospital doctors are more available to reassess the patient and make adjustments in the patient's care because they are on site, not having to go back and forth to their clinic.
- Finally, there has been a change in how long patients are held in the hospital. Eighty years ago a woman stayed in the hospital for weeks after having a baby. Today, insurance companies put enormous pressure on hospitals to get patients discharged as soon as possible. However, some patients may need additional support once discharged, such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, or help with medication changes, etc. This may require that the doctor work very closely with the case management team to ensure each patient has the assistance he or she needs.

Close Coordination with Your Family Physician

Be assured the hospitalist does not replace the patient's family care physician. In fact, the hospitalist acts as a liaison between the patient and his or her doctor. The patient's care plan is closely coordinated, meaning the family doctor is continually updated on the patient's status.

On Acute Care

When you are admitted to Coffeyville Regional Medical Center your care is provided by a hospitalist while you are an inpatient. A Hospitalist is a physician who specializes in caring for patients in the hospital and does not have an outpatient medical practice. Most Hospitalists are Internal Medicine physicians or Family

Practice physicians. Some are trained as specialists in Pulmonary, Critical Care, Cardiology or other sub specialties. The Hospitalist consults with your doctor, maintaining a regular communication with him or her during your stay and receives valuable information about your medical history, medications and special needs.

"As in every aspect of life, communication is key. And, with the hospitalist program at CRMC, we work very hard to communicate with the patient's doctor so that doctor knows why the patient was admitted, and what transpired during the hospitalization. Here at CRMC every patient that is discharged on a weekday already has a follow-up appointment with his or her primary care provider before they leave the hospital, and the discharge summary is faxed to the primary provider's office."

Dr. Russell completed medical school at the University of Texas Medical School at Houston in 2013, and recently completed his General Surgery Residency at Texas A&M University in Temple, Texas (located north of Austin, Texas). Asked why he decided to become a physician, Dr. Russell said, "My undergraduate degree was in Electrical Engineering. REHABILITATION DEPARTMENT

The rehabilitation team consists of several professionals in a variety of disciplines working together in conjunction with your referring physician. Speech and physical therapists work to provide individuals a path to enhanced living.

Speech Therapy

Speech/language therapy is the treatment of individuals ranging from pediatrics to geriatrics with speech/language disorders. Speech/language pathologists are professionals educated in the study of human communication, its development, and its disorders. Speech/language pathologists typically treat problems in the areas of articulation; dysfluency; oral-motor, speech, and voice; and receptive and expressive language disorders. A speech-language pathologist will also address swallowing dysfunctions affecting nutritional intake.

Individuals may require speech-language therapy for a variety of reasons:

- Producing sounds in syllables/saying words incorrectly
- Stuttering/slurred speech
- Oral motor deficits
- Swallowing disorders etc.

Aquatic Therapy

Qualifications for aquatic therapy are dependent on each patient- high pain levels, multiple sites for pain, weight bearing restrictions, post op conditions, low back pain and overall weakness are just a few diagnoses where aquatic therapy may be beneficial.

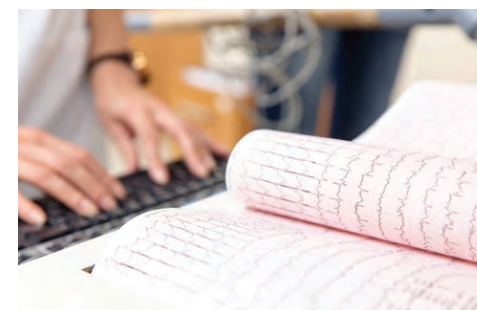

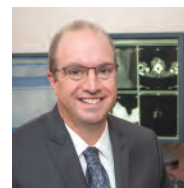
