GETTING TO THE YOUNG CENTRE


THE YOUNG CENTRE IS TORONTO'S CULTURAL HUB LOCATED IN THE HEART OF THE DISTILLERY HISTORIC DISTRICT.

PARKING: There are parking lots in the Distillery District with entrances on Parliament Street and Cherry Street.
These lots fill up quickly, especially on weekends.
However, there are other parking lots close by, north of Mill Street on the west side of Parliament Street, and there is underground parking on the south side of Mill Street west of Trinity Lane.

TTC ACCESS: From King Station or St. Andrew Station (Line 1), take the new King Streetcar (514 Cherry) directly to the Distillery Historic District.

From Castle Frank station (Line 2), take the Parliament Bus (65) to Front Street. Walk one block south to Mill Street and walk east towards the Distillery District.

From Union Station, walk to the southeast corner of Front and Bay Streets and take the eastbound bus (121) to Mill Street at Cherry Street.
